Besides a couple weeks in November, the baseball season was largely unaffected by COVID restrictions. There was certainly a level of nervousness regarding the shutdown in November, both from a playing perspective as everyone was getting into the 'swing' of things and the obvious financial implications. Whilst we have continued to work hard to secure our future with sound budgeting, financial processes and being strict in managing the affairs of the club, due to COVID in 2019/20 we did find ourselves falling short and not meet our budget. The plan had been coming together and we were feeling extremely optimistic about the season, so November's shutdown was a nervous wait. Thankfully, it was short, and the season soldiered on without issue for the remainder. I cannot be more pleased with our position at seasons end and when considering what we deem success I think there are some key elements that make 2020/21 an extraordinarily successful season.

- 1. Strong membership numbers (230 registered members)
- 2. Strong financial position at the end of the season (Season profit of over 28K)
- 3. Two Junior Premierships (U13 and U15) & Two Senior Premierships (Div 5 and Div 6)
- 4. Division One returning to finals baseball.

The continued relationship with the council is also very pleasing. We saw several key aspects come together during the season and will benefit from these over the coming years.

- 1. Maintenance program initiated which included the repairs of the eaves, new air conditioning and gutters.
- 2. Presentation of a five-year lease.
- 3. Preliminary proposal for a redevelopment of Patterson Reserve and surrounds.

We continue to see growth in women's baseball at East Torrens and it is extremely pleasing to see so many giving it a go. Two teams this season, after only 2 seasons in the competition, with our first finals appearance. Well done to all involved, with a special mention to Tony Probert who has driven this program over the past 3 years. He has created a legacy at the club, and it is so pleasing to see such legendary names of the East Torrens Baseball Club such as McKinlay & Lamb as well as new names with baseball and East Torrens becoming a family affair, having all members from juniors to men and women's baseball taking part. A big thank you to those who have continued to help with the expansion this season including Dylan and Aaron Rollins.

We have identified that growth is challenging due to only having one senior diamond, so whilst we have eight men's teams and two women's senior sides, there is limited capacity to play more baseball at Patterson Reserve. It is with this in mind the proposal for a redevelopment will from our perspective aim to deliver two senior sized diamonds, along with the current two options for junior fields. Whilst we will not be able to expand to more than three diamonds, creating an option for more senior baseball to be played will be extremely positive for our club as well as continuing to expand options for junior baseball. The redevelopment is only in its early planning stages and there is a lot of work to do, but it is an incredibly positive time for our club, the local community and sport and recreation in general.

We will also have by the time the 2021/22 season rolls around, signed a 5-year lease, something we have not had in place since our last least back in 1994. For decades we have relied on seasonal permits, and I am very appreciative of the Norwood Payneham and St Peters Council for supporting us in securing our future at Patterson Reserve.

With our future looking bright, sponsorships continue to be vitally important and we at East Torrens have an amazing and supportive group of sponsors. They are all highlighted throughout this annual report, and I continue to urge all members where possible to support these amazing companies. Thank you to Blake Armstrong who works hard to not only secure new sponsors but support our current group and ensure they benefit as we do from their support. I would like to individually thank Roger Steen Crash for sponsoring the Senior Squads training shirts this season and their ongoing support of our club. We also welcomed the Honourable Vincent Tarzia, who has come on board to support us. He was present to throw out the first pitch at a women's game this season and we look forward to working with him in progressing all aspects of the sport in the community. In 2022 the electoral boundaries will change and hence the Hon Vincent Tarzia will become our local member. Welcome on board.

We also saw the Strategic Intent 2018-2021 come to a close and whilst evaluating our success in acheveing some of our goals, I am please with the overal result.

Whilst COVID impacted our ability to progres a number of these items and with the planned redevelopment meaning a reevalutaion of our financial priorities, it has been a pleasing outcome. Many of the items not fully complete will be carried over into the new Strategy 2025 and whilst Strategic Intent 2018-2021 has concluded it has formed a number of pathways and processes that will provide structure and stability moving forward as part of business as usual.

Some of the key elements which we have been able to complete are the **Constitution and By-Laws** update, the expansion of our **Women's Baseball** membership including our first foray into finals. There was a lot of concern regarding the impact of COVID on registrations, but I am pleased we have been able to maintain our **Membership** levels and continue to see growth in this area. **Junior Development** continues to see a strong representation in charter, state and national junior programs as well as the strength of our junior program. The key for this area is now managing a sustainable future for junior coaching to maintain the quality work of the junior program.

We have been able to write and implement a number of key policies with good effect, including a number that relate to **Financial Management** and this has meant a positive return in 2020/21. With the introduction of a cashless club in 2020/21 we continue to improve our financial position and look forward to further improving our finances as we approach a redevelopment. Big thank you to Kylie Powell as Treasurer for her meticulous work in managing the clubs financial affairs.

A 5-year lease presented to us shows the strength of our relationship with Council and along with the redevelopment and current maintenance being undertaken which is helping to improve our members Experience it is an exciting time at Patterson Reserve. We also see good engagement with State Government and welcome on board current sitting member the Hon Vincent Tarzia, who has provided support to our club this season and into 2021/22.

We were pleased with the outcomes of several strategies, although some areas were not as complete as we were hoping. There is still a gap in our Recognition of our volunteers. The aim was to introduce a Volunteer of the Month/Week program, this however did not occur, so we continue to see a need to develop further in this area. We continue to see strong support from several people including several new families to the club. It is vital we do more to recognise this input as it is integral to our overall success. Likewise, our engagement with Past Players / Members did not improve and with no dedicated day held in 2020/21 this is a critical area for improvement.

Regarding the Bar and Canteen, we were able to complete the electrical work to make the canteen safe and functional but have decided it is not feasible to move the bar to the southern end of the clubhouse at this stage. We also have not been able to improve our Energy position and whilst every effort has been made with the current facility to be as efficient as possible, more work needs to be done. New air conditioning has been installed, and we look to work with Lacrosse and Council on options for Solar as well as working with council on upgrading the Hot Water services.

We also see a need to put more of a focus on Staff Development and develop a clear approach to build a sustainable future for our junior coaching numbers. Whilst we will continue to support all development opportunities, ensuring a broader approach to developing future coaches, scorers, umpires, managers, and committee members is crucial to our ability to maintain a sustainable future.

Community Engagement continues to be a critical element of future success and whilst we have continued to build a strong relationship with the Canine Club, a large amount of work is still required to promote opportunities within our club to the local community, not only for our membership base but for other positive financial impacts. This includes improving our access to groups such as those with a disability, which requires improvements in our infrastructure to support this Inclusion. It is not feasible to upgrade the current clubrooms and hence a large element of improving this area comes with the redevelopment. This must not however restrict our desire to expand our accessibility and support in this important area.

Finally, a review of our engagement with Schools and our T-Ball program is required. We continue to see consistently low numbers and whilst we see our Friday T-Ball program still offering a quality product and the development of a strong Under 9 program playing in the Baseball SA competition, a review is required.

Strategy 2025 will aim to address a number of these key areas for development whilst having an equally strong focus on what fundamentally is required to maintain our current position as well as set ourselves up for success during the redevelopment. It is important whilst we aim to evaluate and change some aspects of our function, we must not lose sight and importantly effort in performing at our best in several key functions. I would like to acknowledge the Executive Committee for all their hard work for what is ultimately 12 months of the year, preparing for the season, managing the season, and reflecting and working towards resolving issues of outcomes from the season, thank you to you all and the people that support you and allow you to do the work you do. There is a lot of work done behind the scenes and I thank each and every one of your for your assistance.

The canteen was a challenge again this season after losing Caitlyn (for good reason, congratulations on the birth of Elijah Luke and Caitlyn). But a massive thank you to Angela Probert and Katherine Ashworth who did most of the heavy lifting with the canteen. A special mention also to Trish Hollands for her support in the canteen.

To the all the coaches for their efforts throughout the year. There is a lot beyond just coaching baseball, and I appreciate assisting in finding umpires, assisting in the canteen or grounds can be tedious, it is extremely valuable to our success, so thank you for your assistance in making this happen. Congratulations also to Tony Probert who was named the Coach of the Division One Team of the Year.

The ET family is something everyone should be proud of, and I am continually blown away by the generosity of members and their families in support of this club. Thank you to everyone who helped throughout the year.

Special mentions to Steve Yeatman, social media giant and can statistically prove it as well and his and Marnie's monstrous support with Regalia. 21/22 will see a fresh new apparel line on offer. Darian King for negotiating the equipment position. Payne Sowter (ably assisted by Stef Gratton) for making sure all games were umpired. Congratulations as well to Payne for winning the Paul Begg Umpire of the Year award. Big shout out to Bob Hollands behind the bar, Trish Hollands for so many reasons again and congratulations on both winning the Club Patrons Trophy, very well deserved. Karryn Przbilla for being our scorers delegate and Anthony Dienelt for continuing to work with the future of our club in the T-Ball program and strengthening Under 9 PeeWee program. SECRETARY REPORT

The 2020-21 Season began under the challenges of a pandemic, which is how last season ended, with the landscape of management having challenges like never before. With the support of the SA Health and the State Government, East Torrens was provided with a Covid Safe Plan, that meant that the clubrooms and playing members were required to adhere to room capacity restrictions, on field hygiene practices and maintaining social distancing in order to keep everyone safe. As the Secretary of the club, maintaining this level of detail and restrictions initially felt like a full time job on it's on, however it soon became the new normal and it was heartwarming to see Baseball Community support it's requirements.

Never did the words..." fife isnt about waiting for the storm to pass, it's about dancing in the rain"...feel more relevant. Jhis pandemic taught us to cherish what we have, to look out for each other a little bit more than normal and to make the most of every minute while we have it..

Within weeks of the season starting we found ourselves in the position of no Canteen Manager, the canteen is our main source of generating income, so the Executive quickly stepped up. TREASURER REPORT

The club's financial year runs from 1st July to the 30th June of each year and as such these accounts are only current as at the 21st June 2021 and will be finalised at the end of June 2021. We do not expect any major changes within this period.

Considering the early restrictions imposed and a few cancelled social events, the 20-21 season has seen the club make a healthy profit of \$28.4k. This is above our anticipated profit of \$2.9k and a considerable improvement on last year's loss of \$6.5k. Whilst our total income was only up 7.6% year on year our total expenses were down 31.9%. The absence of an import and Canteen Manager along with lower coaching costs and some cautious spending all contributed to this season's lower expenses.

This season the committee made the conscious decision to go cashless. Precarious as it seems, did not impair the club's sales, in fact sales for both bar and canteen were slightly higher than last year by \$3.7k (10.9%) and \$1.1k (2.9%) respectively. Although unexpected, it is a pleasing result. We head into next season debt free and in a comfortable financial position.

Our bar performance this year was slightly above both budget and last year and with the inclusion of a few private functions, the bar's total profit for the year was \$22.8k. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped behind the bar and an even big thank you to Bar Manager, Bob Hollands for your outstanding effort and contribution. The bar would not have run so smoothly without you!

Total canteen sales of \$37.2K was slightly higher than last year whilst our costs were considerably lower compared with last year. The end result for this season was a profit of \$18.6k, mainly due to the loss of our canteen manager early in the season. A big thank you to Angela Probert and Katherine Ashworth for taking charge and going above and beyond to make sure the canteen could still function.

This season Steve Yeatman took on Regalia and did an amazing job with total sales of \$11.5k. Whilst the total profit of regalia for 20-21 should have been \$2.6, unfortunately due to a few former 19-20 adjustments having to be taken up this season, resulted in a reduced profit for 20-21 of \$1.6k.

Total membership revenue this season was a little higher than both budget and last year, with only \$237 in membership fees outstanding as at 21st June. A big thank you to Katherine Ashworth for doing an exceptional job of taking care of all the club memberships.

I have to make a special mention to Life Member John King, who selflessly collected and recycled all the cans and bottles from the club to help out this season's East Torrens Charter Representatives. He managed to raise nearly \$800, which was matched by East Torrens Don Rice Foundation and each East Torrens Charter Player received a small contribution towards the cost of being a part of a Charter Team. Outstanding effort, thank you John!!

I would like to send a big thank you to all those volunteers who put their hands up to help out this season, without your contribution our club would not be where we are today. And finally, I would like to thank the Executive Committee for their tireless efforts and dedication to our club. It is an honour to work with you all and I look forward to another year of fun and success together. Thank you again.



Season 2020 / 2021, despite the challenges posed by a global pandemic, was a successful season for the senior squad.

Due to Covid restrictions and challenges we faced a season with no import. This placed a large workload on our local pitching staff and need to replace considerable offensive production. Interestingly, some imports still found their way onto local rosters, further complicating the season.

The work of the senior coaching staff and playing group over the last four years began to bear fruit amid these opportunities. Overall, we finished the season in 5th place with 16 wins and 14 losses. A late season surge saw us win 5 of 6 games, earning the squad it's first playoff berth in many years.

Across the season there were many individual achievements, some nail-biting, exciting games, a few heartbreaking losses and 4 key squad events that contributed to the success.

- The late season charge was a key improvement for the squad that paved the way to a finals berth. Rather than defensively trying to hold position, the senior squad attacked the final games to climb into 5th position on the ladder.
- Riley Yeatman not only established himself as a key starter on the Division One team, he won the Rookie of the Year and the Golden Arm in the 'Super-League'. To cap these achievements off the young ace signed a professional contract with the San Diego Padres. Riley was also voted Division One MVP
- The squad was able to blood up to 5 young, debutante players throughout the season. This included Boyd Worden who was selected to participate in the Australian Baseball 'Showcase' series.
- A member of the senior team was selected to the SABL 'Team of the Year'. Charlie Ashcroft had a stellar year, leading the team with 9 wins and 3 losses, sporting a 2.25 era.

The success of the senior squad was most impressive considering further challenges that truly tested the depth of the program and our development across the last 4 years.

- We lost Carter Powell to a back injury early in the season, forcing positional shuffles to cover the catching position. This was filled superbly by Jay Sanderson, creating further needs on the infield.
- What promised to be the strongest starting rotation in the SABL was decimated by Christmas. Charlie suffered an elbow injury in the last games of the first half, Jack Higginbotham followed with a shoulder injury and Riley Yeatman was called prematurely to the ABL Adelaide Giants roster.
- Luke Chandler suffered his second injury in as many years.

In response, our field shuffled, Jay performed well, getting the best out of our young pitching staff. Our signature defence continued to prove the backbone of our game and our relief pitching came to the fore. Jaryd Hardman starred in several games late and Troy Chandler stood up to become the most reliable reliever, ensuring we stayed in many games throughout a critical part of the season. Troy finished the season with a 2.00 era.

In the field, several key juniors seized opportunities. Ryan Przibilla was crucial, filling many roles due to injury and unavailability and Boyd Worden cemented himself as both an offensive threat and valuable defensive addition.

Offensively, while we were quite inconsistent, there were great improvements. None larger than the contribution from Zak Heintze-Unger. The talented youngster carried the offense the first half of the season, winning several games off his own bat. He finished the season with an impressive .361 batting average, leading the squad in hits (35).

Ashcroft then attacked 5th place Kensington, setting up a 10-0 shutout that allowed us to leap into 5th position.

Unfortunately, the challenge of our first senior finals campaign in some time got away from us. Juggling unavailability, injuries and the limitation placed on Riley by the Padres we lost the first series against Henley and Grange in straight sets. The series giving our young men excellent experience in what it takes to compete at the next level .

Paul Ashworth ran the Division three team with patience and poise, making key contributions to our developing youth. Kym Ashworth took on a greater role, contributing to Div One defensive plays, assisting with the load of pitching prospects and assisting the Div 3 team.

Thank you also to Calvin Chipperfield. Chip took on the role as a mentor on our squad, giving up his time to check in on our players, give advice and pass on in his wealth of pitching knowledge.






