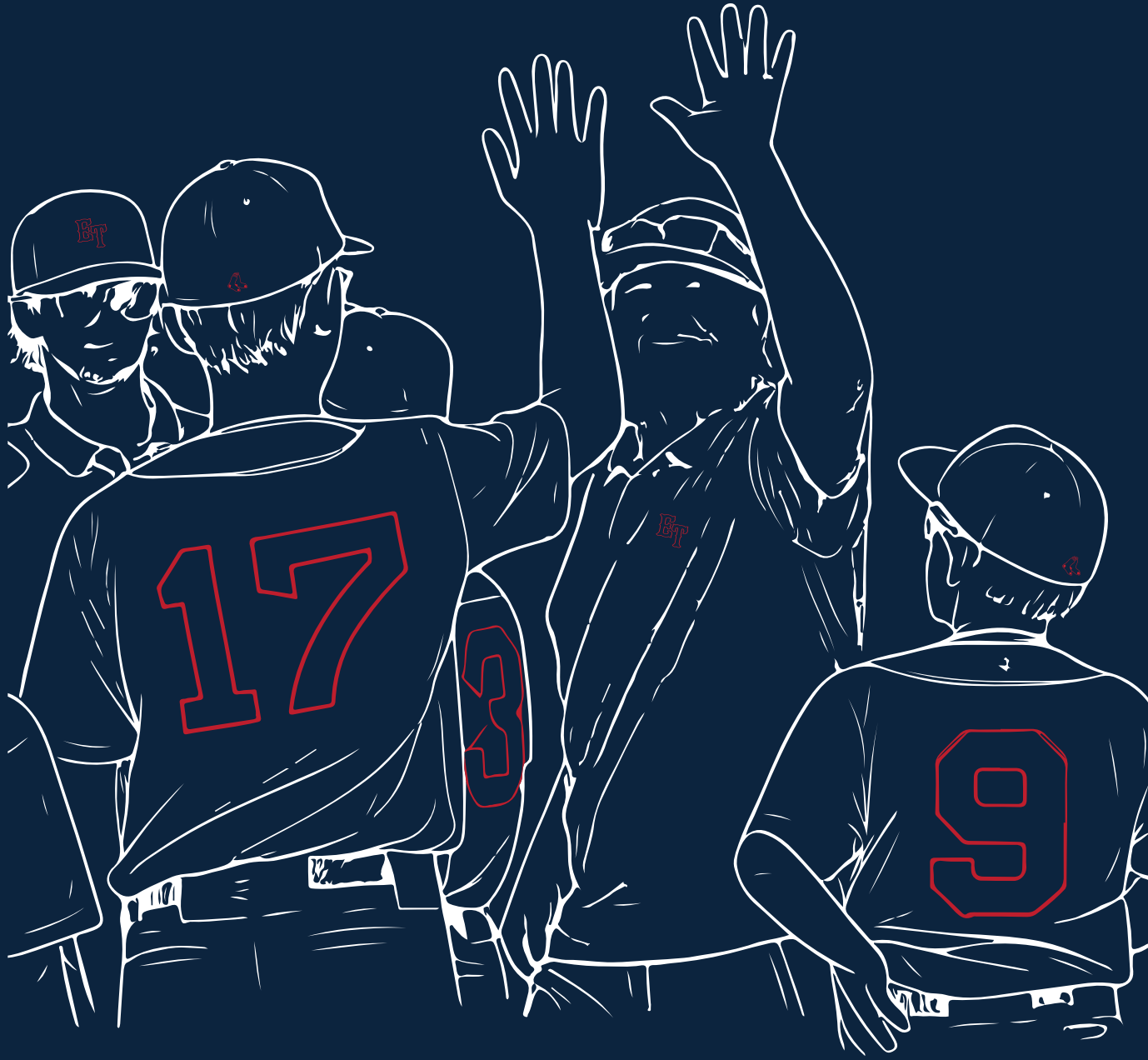

TREASURER

The Club's financial year runs from 1 July to 30 June each year. Accordingly, the financial information presented in this report is current as at 28 June 2026 and is reported on a cash basis. Final accounts will be prepared following the end of the financial year on 30 June 2026. A small number of expenses are still expected to be received and processed prior to year-end, and therefore the figures contained in this report remain subject to minor adjustment.

The 2025/26 season has delivered an estimated operating surplus of more than \$30,000, representing an outstanding financial result and likely one of the strongest in the Club's history. This achievement would not have been possible without the continued support of our sponsors, the dedication of our volunteers, the tireless efforts of the Committee, and the contributions of our members through memberships, bar and canteen purchases, fundraising activities, and club functions.

It is also important to acknowledge the significant contribution of grant funding secured throughout the year. In particular, the Yard Ball Grant secured by Amber, along with several other grants successfully obtained by Carmen, have provided substantial financial assistance and helped offset a number of Club expenses. The considerable time and effort invested in preparing and submitting grant applications is greatly appreciated, and it is hoped that the Club will continue to secure similar opportunities in future years for the benefit of our members and facilities.

Cash sponsorship revenue, including Player Sponsorships, totalled \$51,200 for the year. This is a remarkable achievement and represents an increase of approximately \$26,000 compared with the previous financial year. Our Vice President and Sponsorship Manager successfully attracted several new sponsors while continuing to foster strong relationships with our existing sponsors. I'd like to extend sincere thanks to all sponsors for their valued support and commitment, and we look forward to continuing these partnerships in the years ahead.

Financial Highlights

- Bar sales increased by 11%, with profit improving by almost \$4,000.
- Canteen sales increased by 18%, with profit increasing by approximately \$2,900.
- Regalia and uniform sales increased by 44%.
- The Beyond Bank Term Deposit balance, with interest reinvested, has grown to \$53,237.
- The Club purchased a new ride-on mower to support our grounds volunteers, who continue to maintain one of the premier playing surfaces in the league.

I would also like to extend a sincere thank you to all volunteers who have contributed throughout the season. Whether assisting in the canteen and bar, maintaining the clubrooms and grounds, supporting fundraising activities, or helping organise club functions, your efforts are invaluable. The Club relies heavily on volunteer support, and without it, the cost of operating the Club would be significantly higher.

Due to changes in my professional commitments, I will be stepping down from the role of Treasurer following the AGM. It has been a privilege to serve the Club in this capacity.

While my playing days and tenure as Treasurer have come to an end, I look forward to remaining involved with the Club, attending games when I can, supporting our ET teams, and, of course, making the occasional visit to the bar.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve the Club over the past four years.

REGISTRATIONS & MEMBERSHIPS

Thank you to all members for registering and paying their fees in full this season.

Baseball SA raised their fees by 4% across the majority of categories this season however as a club, we opted for a more targeted approach with our fee increases. Junior and Divisions 4-6 fees were increased by just \$5, while a larger increase was applied to Division 3 to bring them in line with Divisions 1 and 2 given the change in structure to their competition. We also decided to raise Women's fees to align them more closely with Divisions 1-6. We did not raise fees for 3-game memberships.

As always our goal is to balance accessibility with financial sustainability, and we believe this approach achieved that.

With regards to registration numbers, we had a total of 212 registered members, compared to 202 last season, representing a 5% increase, which is a pleasing result overall.

The registrations break down as follows:

- 58 Senior Mens (59 last season)
- 36 Senior Womens (27 last season)
- 95 Juniors – T-Ball to U18 (101 last season)
- 15 Yardball (10 last season)
- 8 Volunteers (5 last season)

While our juniors went backwards this season, the growth came from a very successful recruitment drive in our women's program as well as increased participation in our yardball program.

This season, we made positive progress in improving our records for Life Members and volunteers through the establishment of a Heritage Committee. This initiative will assist in ensuring our historical records are accurate and that past players and Life Members remain connected and informed about club activities.

The Heritage Committee will also assess the nominations of new Player Life Members and Life Members, taking over this process from the Life Membership Committee. We acknowledge and appreciate the contributions of the members of the Life Membership committee that have chosen not to continue with the Heritage Committee.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION

The 2025/26 season saw steady progress in East Torrens Baseball Club's (ETBC) commitment to inclusion, member experience and safe, welcoming environments. The club continued to strengthen programs, governance and understanding of member needs. Growth in the Yard Ball and women's programs highlighted the value of inclusive initiatives and player pathways.

Member, Player & Volunteer Engagement: Feedback was gathered from across our baseball community, including players from the Yard Ball, women's, juniors' and men's programs, as well as volunteers. Members described positive team environments, supportive coaching and a strong sense of belonging. They also clearly highlighted the need for clearer communication, better coordination across teams and volunteers, and continued improvements to facilities as the club grows. This feedback is valued and will directly inform planning for the 2026/27 season.

Participation, Leadership & Volunteering: ETBC is committed to creating opportunities for members to contribute in ways that suit their interests, strengths and capacity - from coaching and game-day support to events, sub-committees and leadership pathways. Getting involved beyond the game is a great way to connect with the club community, learn new skills and contribute to a positive environment. We also see real value in supporting young volunteers as they build confidence, gain experience and develop independence. As we look ahead, we encourage members to think about how they might get involved next season. Whether it's a small role or a larger commitment, every contribution is valued and helps us grow as an inclusive club for everyone.

Inclusive Facilities & Club Environment: Members described ETBC as a welcoming and inclusive club, and also highlighted the importance of having facilities that support this experience. The Executive recognises the need for ongoing upgrades to meet the club's growth, and continued to progress this work throughout the season through advocacy, planning and engagement with Council.

Gender Equality & Leadership Development: ETBC continued its involvement in the Raise Gender Equality Program, progressing actions, including advocating for inclusive facilities, increasing mixed-gender events, refreshing the Codes of Behaviour and strengthening the visibility of club values. I was supported to participate in the Marjorie Jackson-Nelson Centre for Women's Sport Program, which provided a valuable opportunity to learn, connect with leaders across sport and highlight the work underway at ETBC.

Thank you to our players, volunteers and families for contributing to a positive, inclusive and welcoming club environment throughout the 2025/26 season.

YARD BALL PROGRAM

The 2025/26 season was another strong year for Yard Ball, offering a welcoming and inclusive way for children, young people and women with disability to learn baseball, build confidence and connect with the East Torrens Baseball Club (ETBC) community. Nineteen participants took part across three programs, with every player from Season 1 returning. Supported by our coaches, buddies and volunteers, players developed new skills, grew in confidence and formed friendships that extended beyond the diamond.

A major milestone this season was a pilot game where our Yard Ball women and teenage girls played their first game of baseball with tailored preparation and support. It was described as a powerful moment of genuine inclusion and a highlight of the year. A big thank you goes to our two Division 3 women's teams for their support and leadership in making this game such a positive and memorable experience. The inaugural Showcase Day was another proud moment, with participants taking the field on the main diamond, throwing the first pitch and sharing the day with Gawler Rangers Baseball Club.

Expansion to Gawler Rangers: This season also marked the first year of Yard Ball at Gawler Rangers. Delivered with real dedication, the program created a welcoming and inclusive environment that was clearly loved by participants and families. We sincerely thank and congratulate the Gawler team for taking on Yard Ball and delivering it with such care and commitment. Their work shows how Yard Ball can grow and create inclusive opportunities across more clubs and communities.

Funding, Recognition and Future Growth: Yard Ball is funded by the Australian Government Department of Health, Disability and Ageing, and ETBC has secured an extension of funding for the 2026/27 season - a significant achievement and recognition of the program's impact. ETBC has also been awarded a grant in partnership with Baseball SA to strengthen inclusive structures and practices across the league. Yard Ball's contribution was acknowledged in the House of Representatives in 2025, reflecting its growing influence in inclusive community sport.

Looking ahead, we are focused on expanding Yard Ball and formalising transition pathways so participants have more opportunities to move into other junior and senior programs at the club.

Acknowledgements: The progress of Yard Ball reflects the commitment of many people across ETBC. The DEI Subcommittee provided leadership and lived experience, while coaches, buddies, volunteers and families created a supportive and welcoming environment each week. The wider ETBC membership also supported the program throughout the season, helping it become a valued part of our club identity - thank you.

JUNIOR COORDINATOR

It was pleasing to see an increase in player numbers in the junior program this season. We entered under 8s, two under 10 teams, two under 12 teams, two under 14 teams and an under 16 team, plus our Tee-ball and yard ball programs.

And to be able to lead this group into the finals in my third year is something I'm proud of.

Along the way we lost a few players — some great players — and some who felt the grass might be greener elsewhere and were ready for a different opportunity. In a way, that galvanised the squad. It created space for others to step up, and we built belief in players who maybe hadn't had it before. We proved that when we play for each other, and not as individuals, that's the way forward — and that's where success starts.

Across these three years, we also took some big scalps: three Bevis Marks Cup wins, some genuine rival games against sides featuring former ET players, and that 100th Year celebration game win, just to name a few. Those are moments that stick, and they say a lot about what this group is capable of.

Before I finish, I just want to thank Kirra, Kason, and Harlan for supporting me through this journey. It's not easy having your husband or your dad as the coach — when most decisions get scrutinised, and you've got to be resilient and take it in your stride. Thank you for the patience, the understanding, and for backing me the whole way.

This squad is on the way up, and I've got real faith in the person who is following me to keep leading these guys and continue driving them toward success. Baseball never really leaves your veins, so you never know what the future holds. But for now, I'm looking forward to taking a much-needed break.
