

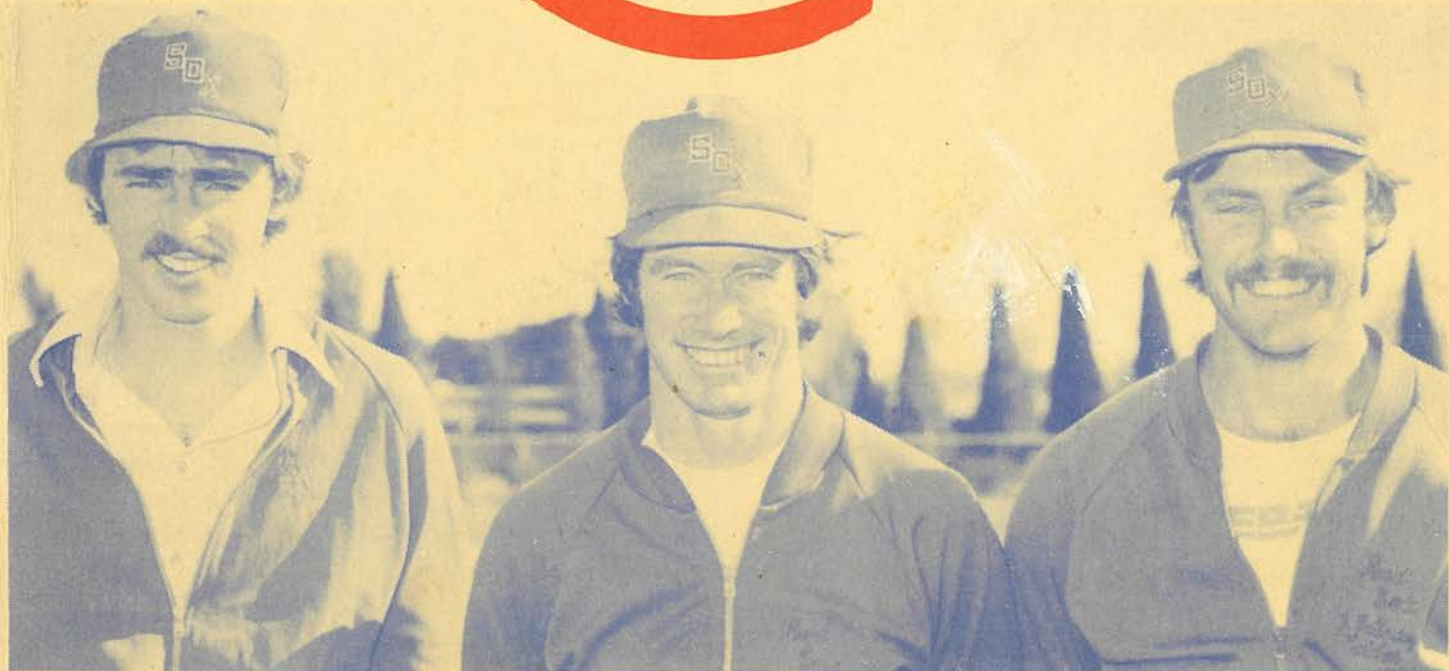

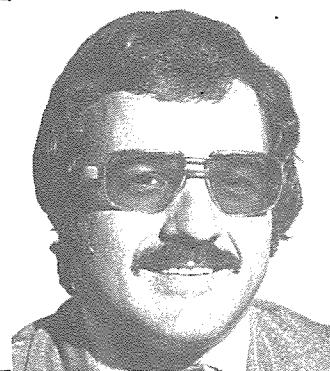

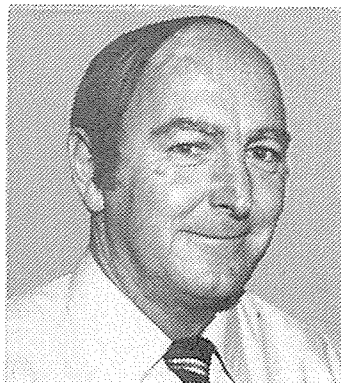

SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT.

For the first time in summer baseball, the Club did not win any premierships in the 1977/78 season, but the amount of finals participation by our teams was equal to that of recent seasons. There were also some outstanding personal achievements by both senior and junior members of the Club in achieving State and Australian selection and polling well in the various grades "best and fairest" medals. Overall, the season should be judged on the success of teams and players, with the potential that this holds for the future.

The Division 1 competition consisted of two series of games and by finishing 4th in series 1 we qualified for the finals elimination round, where we were defeated by a very in-form Sturt team who went on to win the Grand Final. Had we reached the "four" in series 2 we would have automatically qualified for the finals, but due to loss of players in January, we lost too many matches.

The Division 2 team had an exceptional season, finishing minor premiers. A new wave of juniors is emerging in 'B' grade to challenge the young 'A' grade players and this should generally improve our standard and help in the quest for future 'A' grade premierships.

The junior teams of the Club again performed very well. With a team mainly of first year U17 players, the U17's narrowly missed the final four in an extremely high standard Division. Both U15 teams finished in 3rd position and the U15 Blue team reached the Grand Final. Both U13 teams played in Grand Finals.

Teams Nominated

For 1977/78, we nominated five senior and five junior teams.

(a) Seniors Teams were entered in Divisions 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6. We had requested a team in Division 4, but the S.A.B.L. took into consideration the record of the previous season's inexperienced team and placed the 4th senior team in Division 5 where a generally satisfactory result was achieved. The Division 6 team was intended as a social team for older players and achieved its purpose with great success. It was comprised of former players, committee personnel, some of our Laccrosse Club friends, others who did not wish to play higher grades and had the effect of re-introducing several former members to Club activities.

(b) Juniors One U17 team and two teams in each of the U15 and U13 age grades were fielded. We had a problem with numbers in U17 because there were not quite enough for two teams and had to carry too large a team; some lads lost interest. In U15 and U13, the teams were chosen so as to make each team of even standard. With the present system of grading of Junior teams used by the S.A.B.L., this method appears best and the fact that our teams all reached the finals shows our strenghts. However, there may be a change in S.A.B.L. grading methods next season which would warrant selecting experienced and 1st year teams in these grades.

It was pleasing to note the increase in senior playing members, particularly the return of several former junior players to play in senior grades and the return (and in a few cases, welcome) to players in Division 6. Also accorded the status of non-playing members were our new subsidiary sponsors who totalled 21.

Interstate Representatives.

As has become usual in recent seasons, a large number of our players achieved the honour of representing their State and four were chosen to represent Australia.

(a) Seniors David Mundy, John Galloway and Warwick Marks retained their State team positions and Dean Towill gained his first senior State selection for the Claxton Shield games played in Brisbane. After the Brisbane series, the Australian team to play overseas, initially in Korea but now in Italy, was announced and D. Mundy, J. Galloway and D. Towill achieved selection. Congratulations to these players, particularly Dean Towill, and we wish you well on your tour later in the year.

(b) Under 18 Wayne Brooks regained selection in this State team which played in Melbourne. After the series, an Australian team was selected to tour U.S.A. and Wayne was chosen in this U18 International team. Congratulations Wayne. John Towill was appointed Manager of the U18 State team this season and from all reports did a fine job.

(c) Under 15 This State team played in Perth. Geoffrey Bahnert was again chosen and John Lamb and Mark Crafter achieved their first State representation. These boys were very fortunate in belonging to one of the most successful junior State teams in a long time. The team won all games to take out the series.

(d) Under 13 Trevor Bennett was appointed as State U13 Coach to take charge of the team which journeyed to Hobart. From the Club, Garry Morrow, Peter Bennett, Barry McCall and Stephen Langmead were members of the team. Barry achieved State selection in his first year of club baseball.

Medal Winners. Garry Morrow of the Under 13 (Blue Division) team was successful in winning the Carter Medal for Best and Fairest player in that Division. Garry was runner-up last year.

Others who polled well were Dean Towill in Division 1, Wayne Brooks in Division 2 (who was only 1 point behind the winner), Chris Town in U17, John Lamb in U15 and Stephen Langmead in U13.

Trophy Selection. To overcome problems which have arisen in previous years by having team coaches select the most valuable player in their team, a request was made to the Umpires' Association to select the three best Club players in each game. The Umpires did this, and at the end of the season, the votes were opened and counted to determine the best player in each team. A special feature was made of the counting of Division 1 and 2 votes at the end-of-season presentation dinner.

Club House and Grounds. John Lamb has continued to oversight the clubhouse and grounds this season and thanks must go to him for his efforts, particularly in arranging for installation of airconditioning.

1. Airconditioning. After careful investigation of several Quotes, an airconditioning unit was installed in the clubroom area. This made a tremendous difference in warm weather and it was an incentive to encourage greater use of the facilities.

2. Extra Ground. Due to a new S.A.B.L. ruling, it was necessary to obtain a third diamond area to cater for the number of teams fielded. Arrangements were made with East Marden Primary School to use their oval and after Christmas, following an approach from Kensington Club, we were able to share Kensington's ground at Newton. Thanks are due to the East Marden Primary School and Kensington Club for their co-operation and help.

3. Drainage System. The Payneham Council installed a drainage system on the Patterson Reserve during October. The timing of the work was unfortunate, being at the start of the season and causing the S.A.B.L. to transfer some home games to other venues, but in the long run the system has proved beneficial in enabling sprinkler malfunctions and summer cloud bursts to be quickly drained away.

4. Club House Extensions. The long awaited extensions to the Clubhouse are at the time of writing, much closer to fruition. Members will have seen the proposed extended floor plan displayed in the clubroom during the season. In conjunction with the Lacrosse Club, we have reviewed our financial position and advised Council. The Council's architects have prepared sketch plans which have been discussed with the Town Clerk and the architect. We are waiting for the architect to submit a detailed costing and working drawings so that the extensions can be dealt with to finality.

5. Club House Car-park. Members will have observed the landscaping and car-park works during the season, which Council is undertaking in conjunction with the adjacent Youth Centre building. It is expected that the car-park will be sealed. These works will enhance the appearance and amenity of our club grounds in future seasons.

6. Thanks to Payneham Council. Thanks must be expressed to the Mayor, Mr. Norm Wilson, and his council members for the attention being given to Patterson Reserve. Also, to the Town Clerk, Mr. Ray Williams, and his staff for their cooperation in attending to our requests. During the past season various committee members have had contact with Council at all levels and we are appreciative of the time and money spent on Patterson Reserve.

Junior Baseball. The main features of junior operations during the season were the training camp, the formation of a Junior Committee, and the enlargement and division into two venues of the primary school competition. Full details appear in the Junior Convenor's report.

Boundaries Commission. The S.A.B.L. boundaries committee determined new District boundaries for the 1977/78 season. The Club lost the Gilles Plains area but gained a large part of the newly developing outer north-eastern suburbs. The Junior Committee has already started work by introducing baseball to schools in the area and playing some games at Surrey Downs. The Club will need to support this activity and promote the game in these new areas to retain them as our territory.

Public Relations Committee. A new sub-committee was formed with responsibility to generally promote the Club to outside bodies. They have

maintained the long relationship with our principal sponsors, Caj Amadio Constructions and Flinders Estates and also arranged for subsidiary sponsors. A separate report appears elsewhere in this book. Members are familiar with the help given by Caj Amadio Constructions and Flinders Estates, and are asked to give these firms the chance to act when buying or building a house. Your support will in turn support the Club.

The new subsidiary sponsors and their services are listed on pages throughout this book. When in need of the services offered, your custom will help strengthen relations between these sponsors and the Club.

The Bath Hotel at Norwood has continued to support the Club, and also provide good service to the Bar Committee and at our Social functions.

Management Committee. Once again, your committee personnel have had a busy season. Committee meetings were held monthly (except for January due to absences at interstate series) and were in the main well attended. There has been a sub-committee meeting regularly with the Lacrosse Club on matters of joint concern, mainly the clubhouse extensions, and several ad hoc sub-committees have met and reported on various matters. New members this season were J. Galloway and J. Hosking. P. Pike continued to perform the role of player's representative and attended almost all meetings.

At the time of writing John Lamb has indicated that he will be unable to continue next season. Also, I regret that I will not be available. All members are asked to consider carefully and if you feel that you can be of service, please use the nomination form at the front of this book. The Club, like all clubs, needs people to keep it functioning and achieve our aims of promoting and fostering the great game of baseball.

Personal Thanks. Throughout my three years as Secretary, I have endeavoured to work for the Club to the best of my ability. I hope that by and large I have helped the members and players of the Club to participate in baseball. I owe much thanks to my fellow committee men and team coaches who have helped and co-operated in the efficient running of day-to-day matters.

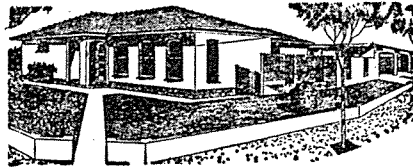

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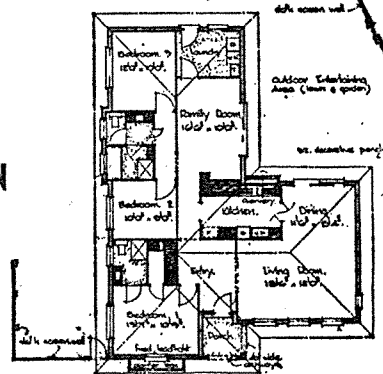
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TREASURER'S REPORT. 1977/78

Members of the East Torrens Payneham Baseball Club.

I have pleasure in presenting my twenty-first report on the financial position of the Club.

I consider that the past season has confirmed one factor - the reliance by the Club on social and other outside fund raising activities if it is to function successfully within acceptable costs to players.

Our current financial position is satisfactory but an examination of the expenses for the year shows an ever increasing cost structure which I consider is fast becoming prohibitive. A typical example is our incurred costs to the South Australian Baseball League and Umpires Association. These costs in total over the past three years have been 1975/76 \$1020; 1976/77 \$1462; 1977/78 \$1932 and it can be seen that real problems of finance will shortly arise unless these trends can be arrested.

The sources of income are, of course, quite evident and reflect the hard work of our various sub-committees - Social Club and Bar who must be congratulated on their year's performance.

In addition our new Public Relations Committee has started extremely well and its efforts indicate that there are many sources of funds available which require only hard work and some ingenuity to realize significant returns to the Club.

Our Senior Sponsors have continued to assist the Club and their efforts have been backed by numerous Subsidiary Sponsors including the Bath Hotel with its valued assistance of beer ticket revenue. I can only repeat the previous advice to support these businesses who have undertaken to support your Club.

Similarly continued support of our sub-committees is essential. This will become even more necessary in the event that we undertake a commitment for Club Room extensions. We have been excellently served with Club Rooms by the Payneham City Council under the leadership of our Patron, Mayor Norm Wilson, but the time has come that increased facilities are essential if we are to progress in promoting Baseball competition. However costs are involved and it is only the support of Club members that can justify any venture of this nature.

One matter that has caused concern this season is the payment of player subscriptions - in a word slow. Player subscriptions are due by the 30th November each year and have been so for many years. There is little doubt that the incoming Committee will closely look at this situation next season. As a first measure it will undoubtedly become necessary to display a financial membership list in the Club Rooms to ensure the protection of our permit.

In closing I wish to thank all members who have assisted me during the past season. I feel certain that the Club can enter the coming season with confidence.

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COACHES' REPORTS

CLUB & DIVISION 1. CLUB COACH: D. MUNDY.

No premierships were gained this season which is dissapointing and a sign of an unsuccessful year if you gauge the Clubs success by the winning of premierships, but there were some very good individual performances which bought credit and honour to E.T.P.B.C.

One of the five senior sides Division II had a very successful season by finishing Minor Premiers but failed to finish off the year when it was defeated in the Preliminary final.

The other senior sides with the exception of Division I started slowly and with little success but finished up by winning a few games near the end of the season when they began to work more as a unit and play up to some of their potential.

The Junior sides again were to the fore with 4 out of 5 competing in the finals series and with 3 finally making it to the Grand Final but without the joy of winning.

The Club needs to continue to develop these sides so that the gap between some of the Divisions can be bridged.

The Club had more than its share of State and Australian representatives which has been mentioned in the Secretarys Report and these individuals bought success and credit to E.T.P.B.C.

The season started with Division I & II having 5 weeks preseason training. The Club practices then started and continued for 4 weeks with Division I & II players being divided into 2 groups to be responsible for conducting & implementing the training program for group 1, seniors and U17 and group 2 U15 and U13. This enables various basic skills to be taught and practiced prior to team practices beginning. It also was supposed to help players to become familiar with one another and be one club. We then had a Junior camp which was for Club members which proved to be even more successful than camp in the past. Division I & II players again managed this task. Teams men were selected and players were committed to team practices under their team coaches.

Throughout the season some coaches used players for team practice sessions and players were invited to attend Division I & II training to specialist coaching. Selection was carried out once a week at which selection of teams were made (Senior) and coaching problems aired by coaches attending.

The Club is functioning reasonably well in the area of coaching but a few more people are needed to man some gaps in the organisation. It is set up in 3 sections. Seniors (U17) Juniors (U15, U13) and Primary School each of which needs a Co-ordinator. The Primary School system is developing extremely well under R. Abbey and D. Dewar and has expanded with the advent of another centre at Surrey Downs. This and with the Juniors is a much needed part of the club and I would liketo express my appreciation to all the people who are making this a successful part of E.T.P.B.C.

In Division I we had a better Win - Loss record (13 wins, 10 losses) than the previous year. But only managed to finish 5th. We started off extremely well winning 11 out of the first 14 games and then crashed terribly by only winning 2 out of the last 9. This has been the trend for the last 2 seasons and it must be overcome.

In series 1 we managed to stake a claim for the finals by winning 8 games and finishing 4th. We batted extremely well and scored 81 runs to 35 against which gave us the required percentage to make the four. Our defence was good with R. Smith and W. Marks sharing the pitching honours and the field backing up by only making 19 errors.

In series 2 we started well by winning the first 3 games scoring 23 runs for and only 2 against. Then the State team went away and R. Smith came down with glandular fever and that was the finish of us. We only defeated Woodville and West Torrens in the next 9 games. We only scored a total of 57 runs even though our batting (number of hits) was better than the first series. We just could not bat our runs in and did not base run very sensibly at times. Our defence became ragged and tallied up 32 errors which was very disappointing.

A more concentrated attitude and approach is needed by all so that these slumps do not occur.

In regards to individual performance D. Towill had a great year both in the Club and in his first year as a State representative by winning our best and fairest, finishing 3rd in the Capps medal, runner up in the Australian Championships batting trophy and being selected in the Australian team. Dean's ability is now beginning to show through and it is great to see. Well done Dean.

R. Martin and W. Towill had an opportunity to play in the top grade whilst the State team was away. Russell finished off a very good year by playing the last 9 games in Division I and winning the batting trophy. Wayne pitched extremely well when given the opportunity. W. Brooks showed his potential by his performance in the State U18 team. Continued progress is looked for by these players and other younger players who also had the opportunity to play higher grades and did well. A lift is needed by all in every area of play in the future if we are to climb up the ladder from 5th position.

Thanks to all those who helped in the running of the Club during the season. Team coaches and managers, scorers, bat boys, the committees - Management, Social and Bar.

A special thanks goes to the wives, girlfriends, supporters and sponsors of the Club for their continued support.

the umpire calls out "Ball." But the pitch skips over the plate and the batter slams it over the right field wall. Is this a homer?

Yes. The umpire erred in calling the pitch too soon. The batter may hit a pitch even though it first touches the ground. (5.03, 7.05a Case Book 2.00)
