## SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT

The baseball season this year was a very full programme with games being played on Saturdays, every Sunday and some Wednesday nights which kept players and supporters on their toes, some were thinking of taking up residence for the amount of time spent at the Club. We only gained one premiership but achieved the top award in the Division 1 series, namely, the Advertiser Shield.

### Seniors

With the new format of the 'Super Six' being brought in this year a great effort had to be made by dedicated players to keep up a standard which was proved - Division 1 have qualified by finishing on top of the Sunday competition to gain a berth in next seasons 'Super Six' at Norwood. Division 2 introduced some younger players and this whole team proved valuable and kept Division 1 on their toes. They finished in a good position in the minor round, but lost a hard fought semi-final and were not disgraced at all and their discipline was excellent when tight situations occurred. All except one senior team ended in the final four which still shows strength is still with all senior players. We gained some new players which kept team numbers even and no shortage problems. The new division created for the social players, namely Division 7, attracted a large number of players and also a well deserved Premiership.

### Juniors

The junior teams this year had a successful competition with the Under 17's, at the end, fighting hard and congratulations for their effort by making the four and fought a hard battle for the semi-finals but lost. At the beginning of the season we had a difficult number to try and make two teams but some players did not wish to continue so one team was formed and the overflow played Division 7. The Under 15 grade was represented by two teams equal in strength and a new coach to the club coaching one of them which turned out to be an experience for him and his team. The Under 15 Red team went through to the grand final but lost to a stronger side. The Under 13 grade was an experience in itself with two brand new coaches. The club fielded three teams and these were nearly all new players and a great effort was made and some promising future players are amongst them. This year we tried a new ground, namely, Illyarrie Reserve, which is in the recently developed area of our district, but feel it was a bit too far away and with no facilities, made some days very long when two games were played there. Thanks must go to club members who helped to umpire during the season.

- (b) Under 18 - The state team played in Sydney this year and our two players successful were Barrie Bahnert and Chris Town. John Towill again took on the task of Manager for the team. They had a good series and ended up second to ( you guessed ) Victoria.
- (c) Under 15 - The team this year in Brisbane achieved an all time great by winning the series with first year U/15 state players. Our representatives were Mark Oliver, Michael Giblin and Blake Armstrong. Congratulations.
- (d) Under 13 - This year it was held here in Adelaide and would like this opportunity to say thankyou to the club members and families that billeted the N..S.W. team during this time, a tremendous effort was shown and appreciated by all concerned. The club representative was Andrew Tobin along with the State Coach Trevor Bennett.

Point of Interest

Besides the Division 1 team winning the Advertiser Trophy, two members of that team won awards in the League, namely, Outfielder of the Year was David Price and Infielder of the Year was John Galloway. In the polling for divisional medals C. Town was second for Division 3 and T. Bennett was third in Division 7.

House and Grounds

Ron Kennealy started off in this position then due to overloading in his home (one new son) and work he passed this position over to John Lamb. We saw new ruling brought in by the S.A.B.L. to abandon all cages so our top ground had to suffer, next season after financial situation is reviewed we may be able to erect a net there which has already been approved by the Payneham City Council. The ground was still a bit uneven after the drainage system was installed last season and with Council co-operation this has been rectified. A Red Phone was installed - good for some, bad for others !!!

Clubhouse Extensions

I am pleased to report that after long negotiations with Architects, Lacrosse Club and members of the Payneham Council the go ahead has been given and should see, shortly, builders starting work. Completion as far as we know at this stage estimated sometime in December.

Also, to the Town Clerk, Mr. Ray Williams and his staff for their co-operation in attending to our requests. Junior Baseball

Thankyou must go to this section of our Club for the work put into Juniors at the beginning of the season starting with the camp and trying to fill coaching positions before the season got underway. The Primary School section was a great success again. Full details appear in the Junior Convenor's Report.

Public Relations Committee

This committee works in the background and not all members are aware of this. The number of sponsors gained was by the efforts put in by a small group of members and these firms were displayed on the club room wall. The Club supports these businesses and they in turn support us and without these the club could not function. Our main sponsors are again Caj. Amadio Constructions and Flinders Estates.

Management Committee

This season there was a new face, namely mine, and being accepted into this position as a member immediately gave me a great lift to do my best whilst learning the ropes. John King joined the committee in January to replace John Hosking who was Social Convenor and Geoff Maddison was the new players representative. All members of this committee have followed through and did their part very well with the task allotted to them. Committee meetings were held monthly (except January due to interstate series) and were in the main well attended.

Personal Thanks

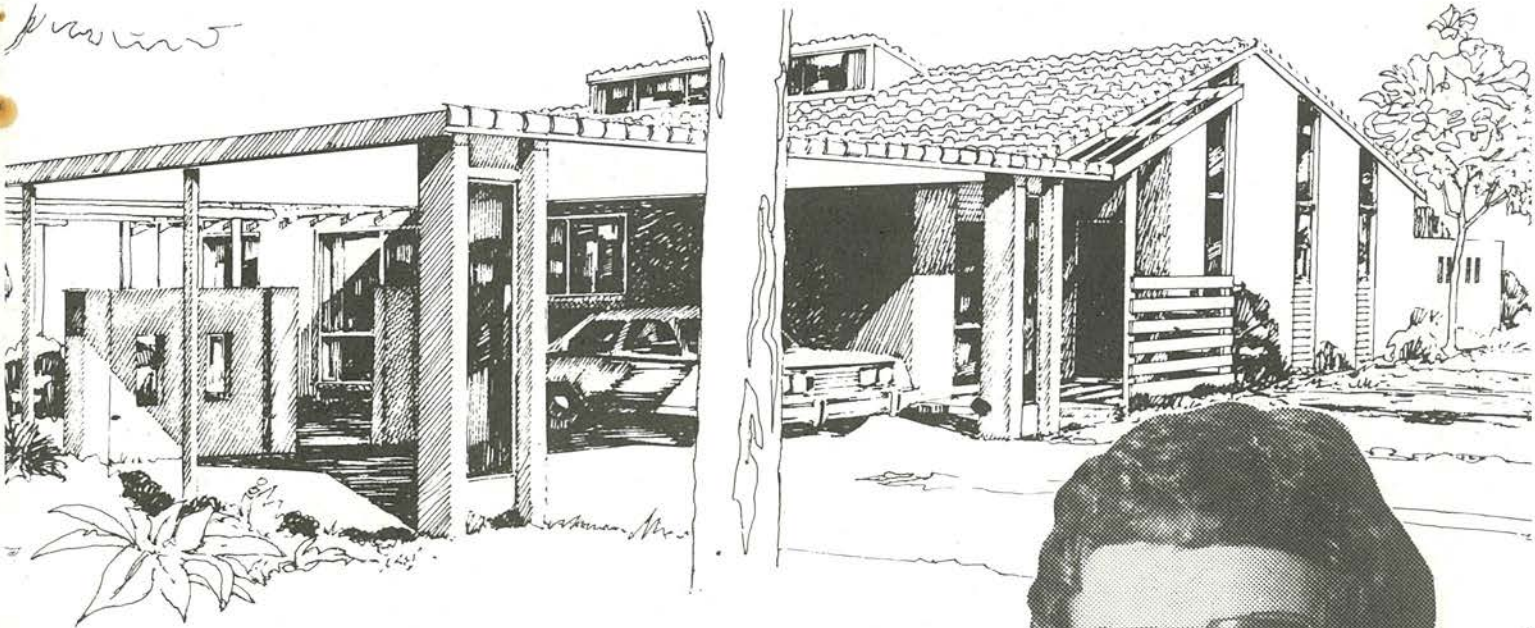

## TREASURER'S REPORT 1978/79

The past season has clearly demonstrated the dependance upon the Social activities and Bar of the Club if we are to meet expenses of administration without massive increases in Playing Subscriptions. Currently subscriptions represent less than 20% of total receipts.

However, we are now entering a new situation with the rebuilding programme in respect of our Clubrooms which will require a further investment of near \$4,000.00 per season (in addition to furnishing) from Club finances. It is quite evident that the Club will need to fully utilize the new facilities as a source of revenue if we are to meet commitments. The incoming Committees will have initial promotional and organising obligations clearly different from those in the past.

The other main sources of income are our Sponsors - Senior (Caj. Amadio), Junior (Flinders Estates - Trevor Armstrong) and Subsidiary (as advertised in this Annual Report) - whose support is greatly appreciated by the Club, the ticket receipts from our valued supporters at the Bath Hotel (Keith Ward) and the Insurance commission through our current agency with the National Mutual Insurance Group Mr. Mal Day has given us excellent support in organising this new operation.

Administration expenses are continuing to escalate - the main being those in respect of dues to the Baseball League (including Umpiring) and the inevitable demands of playing equipment. There is little likelihood of any reduction in future thus making even more important the support of Club Social activities.

However, as stated before, significant upgrading of the excellent facilities which have been provided by the Payneham City Council under the leadership of our Patron Mayor Norm Wilson will, and must, give us the opportunity to expand revenue raising operations.

I would like to thank all members of the Club who have assisted me during the season.

To the members of the Social Committee for their work throughout the year, to John Hosking for his efforts during the first half of the season and to all those who gave us their assistance during the season my thanks for making our job easier.

To the incoming Social Committee, my best wishes and to all club members may I emphasise what I tried to say earlier that if this club is to survive we must all, whether player, committee or supporter, double the effort we have given in the past - this will be our toughest and most demanding season for many years.

When approached prior to the season to coach the junior side I was hesitant at first to accept but, when it was indicated that if I did not there was a possibility of 13 or 14 lads missing out on a game of baseball I decided to help out.

It was several years since I had been actively involved in the Game and during the first couple of months I was all at sea and quite often was reminded by the lads that things should be done this way and not that. Over the last 6 months I have certainly learned a lot re the Game and this I feel sure will enable to improve the standard of the Primary School Boys' and future "Redsox" players at Dernancourt School.

Of the sixteen games we played including pre-season grading games we managed to win five to finish 4th losing the Semi-final 7 - 5 to Glenelg. It was one of the best games of the season with the lads just not getting the breaks at the right time which I might add appeared to happen during several games throughout the season.

The boys all performed well during the season with all of them doing some excellent things at one time or another during the games. This in itself made it worthwhile. Out of the 11 lads 5 batted .330 or above with Anthony Howie being the leading batter on .449. Fielding was good at times but through lack of concentration they let things get away from them. I haven't exact figures for the year but in the last three-quarters of the season we scored 54 runs, 38 being earned with opposition teams scoring 9 with 36 being earned so that shows with a little more concentration our results would have been much better.

Congratulations to Anthony Howie as mentioned previously the leading batter, Stephen Keats Best and Fairest (Umpire votes) and Matthew White Best all Rounder and Andrew Tobin who gained State selection during the season.

Thanks must also go to Ross Keats, Team Manager, for his assistance and education given to me and the Boys. Thanks also to scorers, Margaret Pollard and my wife Yvonne and as well to the Club in giving me the opportunity to once again become actively involved in a great sport and an excellent Club.

Finally I must thank all the lads and supporters of the Team for support given to me during the season and wish them and as well as the Club every success in the future.

The beginning of October 1978 found the E.T.P.B.C. with two coaches for their Under 13 Little League and too many boys for two sides. By accident this situation was brought to my notice and I decided to accept the challenge and volunteered my services, which to my surprise were called upon.

So here we were starting a new season, with a coach, that had not even played baseball, let alone coach before. A manager who was new to the game, and a scorer that had never scored, and fifteen boys (average age 11 years old) that hadn't played club baseball, except one old hand Aaron Gully. What a truly remarkable combination.

My aims for the season were:

1. To teach the fundamentals of Baseball.
2. To teach sportmanship, I.E. How to win and how to lose.
3. Discipline, to respect and obey my manager and I, Whilst under our control.
4. Lastly, to enable the boys to have fun and so enjoy the game.

I believe, or at least I would like to believe, these aims were achieved.

We played 15 games, won 6, lost 9, of these losses 8 were against second year sides, the other was Kensington which had a second year pitcher and catcher, this battery was the deciding factor of their win. The six wins were against first year sides like ourselves.

Every boy played in every game, perhaps some days they only had one innings in the field, but at least they did participate. They worked hard through the season and gained my respect for their determined effort in two very close games to come from behind and win.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my job as a coach, and would like to thank each boy for giving me that wonderful feeling, that comes from being involved with youth.

The enthusiasm these three boys displayed all season, was so contagious it was caught by the remainder of the team.

My sincere thanks to our manager, Alan McKechnie, to my daughter Karen for scoring, and to the parents, who religiously provided a spectator gallery every week, so strong and vocal, it was the envy of all the other sides we played.

Of the fifteen boys, eight are still eligible for Under 13 next year, To these 8, I hope I have the pleasure of coaching you next year, to the seven that go to under 15, I wish you every success in the future.
