## PRESIDENT REPORT

31st December 2019, the first reports of a cluster of pneumonia cases in Wuhan was recorded. 13th January 2020 the first case was reported outside of China. 30th January 2020 the World Health Organisation declared the novel coronavirus outbreak a Public Health Emergency, then on the 11th March 2020 it was characterised as a Pandemic. Baseball thankfully was able to continue without a lot of concern throughout this period and it thankfully allowed us to almost complete a full season.

We did eventually lose the last week, the ultimate week, and as such lost out on our teams being able to participate in Grand Finals (something many wish to participate in at some point and even more so win). There is no question the right decision was made as public health was the priority, but there is without doubt disappointment for all the 'athletes', coaches, support staff and supporters who had tirelessly navigated their way since October to miss out by one week. On top of this there is also the significant financial implications.

COVID-19 without question has had a significant impact on our club and the sport in general. The restrictions put in place have cost us thousands of dollars in turnover, as well as associated costs in preparation for these events which we are unlikely to recoup. I will leave it for the Treasurer to explain what the final wash up was for season 19/20, but whilst it is not great, it could have been a lot worst and thankfully everyone has remained healthy throughout this period.

I look forward to the ET Family once again coming together and rebuilding in season 2020/21 and I am sure the support will be #etstrong as ever.

With everything going on we as a club have still been able to push forward with a number of projects. I have included a section in this Annual Report covering where we are at with the Strategic Intent (2018 -2021), which will provide detail as to what we have been able to achieve as a club, what steps are still required to fulfill all actions and what barriers we see exists in completing some items.

In 2018 the executive committee endorsed the clubs Strategic Intent, creating a clear vision of the key areas we feel needed to be addressed to ensure a sustainable and successful club. Over the past two years we have been working hard to achieve all outcomes in the strategic intent and with a year remaining it is a good time to reflect on the first two years of what we have been able to achieve and how we envisage achieving the remaining aspects.

#### COMPLETED 100%

#### **Constitution and By-Laws**

The 2019 version of the Constitution and By Laws was endorsed at the 2018/2019 Special AGM and brings about a number of key changes. Both documents can be found on our website. A big thank you to Paul Chandler as our Public Officer for spending time with Consumer & Business Services and getting these officially signed off.

#### ON TRACK 75%

#### Memberships

As a club we have seen a marginal increase in memberships and have reinvigorated the Non Playing Membership. In 2019/2020 we trialled membership cards to give members benefits for their use, something we are looking to expand on in 2020/21. To complete this item as well as increases in the non-playing membership base, we need to continue to push for more registrations in the women's classification and T-ball/U9 ages.

#### Women's Baseball

In 2018/2019 East Torrens saw its first Women's baseball team compete in the Baseball SA Division 2 competition. Again in 2019/2020 we saw strong numbers and hope to continue this trend in 2020/2021 and field 2 women's teams. This achievement would solidify this intent. A big thank you to Tony Probert for making this happen and this year Steve Yeatman for coaching the women's team.

#### **Junior Development**

Through sound consultation we have been able to update the Junior Policy to make all aspect of the Junior Program management clear. This has allowed for consistency in our delivery of the Junior Program. To finalise this action, we need to consolidate our resources and ensure all coaches have all the support they require.

#### Selection

As part of the Junior Policy update, we ensured a clear process for player movement within grades including juniors into seniors was developed and communicated. To finalise this action, we need to review the policy for any required changes to ensure its optimal delivery.

#### **Successful Culture**

Over the past two years we continue to see the junior program thrive and in season 2019/2020 were successful in being awarded the Baseball SA Junior Club of the year. In roads have been made thanks to the hard work of the Senior Coaching staff led by Tony Probert and we are beginning to see a shift in culture in the Senior Team. For this to be successful we now need to ensure at the Division 1, 2, & 3 levels consistent participation in the finals as well as continue to see success in the lower senior grades (to which we have consistently been).

#### Financial Management

In 2018, budgets were defined and processes put in place to ensure better cash management. This included moving our reporting system to a cloud based system, reducing reimbursements by moving to a new bank and using a club debit cards (less cash handling) and continuing to grow the reporting model to keep on top of expenditure. Over the past 2 seasons we have seen significant improvements in our financial management (although COVID-19 has impacted us financially) we have seen significant reductions in lost revenue and increased scrutiny over expenditure placing us in a sound position to consistently manage the clubs finances. The continuing risk is in the income sphere where we see moderate changes annually in registration numbers, decreases in cash sponsorship and then increases in expenditure such as facility hire (10% increase this past season).

#### Policies & Procedures

The Executive Committee have updated and introduced policies to support the function of the club. To finalise this item, all policies require review and a gap analysis conducted to ensure no outstanding policies are required. All new and updated policies can be found on the clubs website at etbc.com.au

#### Grants

The Committee have continually applied for grants not only within the Government Grants arena but more broadly. Thank you to Conor Wilson (Division 7) for his assistance in Grant Applications and research. Connor attended a Grants presentation to help support our cause. In addition thank you to Kylie Paton who was successful in receiving a grant from Telstra for the Club to continue to support the Junior Program. Success in receiving grants and therefore a reduction in facilities and equipment has not been achieved yet, however we will continue to apply in the hope we can secure funding for projects to support the development of player and spectator facilities.

#### On Field

The club has thanks to Australian Fire Services been able to upgrade all field and L -Frame Screens for the safety of participants. This include # L-Frames and # Field Screens. Furthermore, we have upgrade 2 of the 3 batting tunnel nets and laid turf (Thank you to Andrew Couzner) in 2 tunnels. To finalise this item, the remaining large batting tunnel needs to be completed.

#### **Sponsors**

Thanks to social media we have been able to continue to support our valued sponsors. In 2018 we increased our visual support by adding another tier of sponsorship which allowed current and new sponsors to get signage facing Payneham Road. Whilst our sponsorship base has been steady, with a few new sponsors across this period, we need to continue to improve our brand, the opportunities that exists for sponsors and increase their brand in support.

#### **REQUIRES WORK 50%**

#### Recognition

Whilst we acknowledge at every opportunity our volunteers and those who contribute, it has been identified we need to do more throughout the season to acknowledge our volunteers. Discussion have taken place to introduce a Volunteer of the Month/Week program which would include distribution of vouchers or similar. This program will need implementation in season 2020/21 to finalise this item.

#### **Experience**

Minor changes have been made over the course of the past 2 seasons, including updating pictures on the wall, venue hygiene and lighting. Whilst these minor changes ensure a well presented club, the facility requires a significant upgrade. It is expected this intent will not be completed as hoped due to a lack of grant money, no long term lease and a pending 'Master Plan' being developed for the Payneham Pool and Patterson Reserve area.

#### Past Players / Members

We continue to run the Past Players Day and provide as many updates as possible through social media to engage with as many past and current members as possible. Whilst these aspects have been a success, we have had limited success in bringing these members back into the club on a regular basis.

#### Baseball SA

As a committee we have ensured a streamlined approach to communicating with Baseball SA to maximise our communication, we continue to promote and participate in all Baseball SA programs, and publicise actively all Baseball SA Social Media posts through our social platforms.

#### Council

We have in the past 6 months got in writing support for a long-term lease, which we hope to secure by the start of Season 2020/2021. Due to COVID several aspects of this have been delayed but to complete this action a signed lease by the end of the season is require. As part of this commitment we had principal support for a maintenance program to be put in place for the Clubrooms, however to date we have not seen this schedule and are waiting on the possible 'Master Plan' development for Payneham Pool and Patterson Reserve.

#### **Staff Development**

All coaches and scorers are offered opportunities to accredit through Baseball SA and we will continue to offer such support. The key element to completing this action is to explore alternative opportunities for development such as mentoring or other development opportunities identified that can ultimately provide education to a broader group and improve coaching and scoring throughout the club.

#### **Suppliers**

We have consolidated some of our suppliers to minimise wastage and improve efficiency in sourcing and maintaining stock. This includes the use of Fullhammer to reduce the need for Regalia stock and the losses associated with handling stock. This action requires review to ensure pricing is optimal and no further opportunities exists to further improve our position with suppliers.

#### **Bar & Canteen**

The Canteen in 2018/2019 had its electrical upgraded which saw a new sub switch board installed. This has resulted in no ongoing electrical issues and a permanent boiling hot water system in place. The bar relocation is the barrier currently to finalising this item with principal support for the concept by lacrosse in place, however progression is being delayed by the possible 'Master Plan' development of Payneham Pool and Patterson Reserve.

#### HIGH RISK 25%

#### **Community Engagement**

In 2019 both Lacrosse and Baseball in conjunction with Council welcomed the Canine Behavioural School to Patterson Reserve. They will become a regular at Patterson Reserve during baseball season on Monday nights with well over 100 dog's active each night. Further to this we have continue to maintain our Good Sports accreditation and deliver open access training annually around such things as mental health and cyber safety. Whilst this engagement is valuable, we have not been able to deliver on building awareness in the local community as to the opportunities that exists at the baseball club. With the development of Felixstow such opportunities exists to promote our club, however these actions have not taken place to date and therefore place this action at risk of not being achieved.

#### Schools / T-Ball

Schools in our local catchment continue to receive information annually about opportunities to play T-Ball and Junior Baseball at East Torrens. This has on most occasions been too late to provide opportunities for the club to engage in local schools and provide clinics or build other relationships (which should include Baseball SA). As a result we are currently failing in achieving this outcome and to date whilst T-Ball numbers have been consistent, they have been low compared to years gone by.

#### Government

Engagement with Norwood, St Peters & Payneham Council has improved with in writing support for the council regarding the desire to secure a long term lease. Furthermore we have had regular contact with a number of NSP&P Councillors who are all in support of our objectives and needs for the precinct. However there has been a large amount of conversation with very little action hence why this item sits as a high risk. We will continue to try and lock in a long term lease by the end of the 2020/21 season and have a clearer direction (with significant input) regarding the 'Master Plan'.

#### **Player Facilities**

Due to a number of factors, including a lack on lease, lack of grant success and an inactive council we have been unable to improve player facilities including those for the women's teams. The executive committee envisage that this action will not be completed and be reliant on the 'Master Plan'.

#### **Energy**

We have ensured what opportunities exists in maintaining services such as gas hot water and the evaporative air conditioner have been completed as well as ensuring all lighting being upgraded to LED lighting where possible. However, due to the age of such systems for this action to be completed we need to upgrade the gas hot water systems to more energy efficient models as well as improved more efficient air conditioning units. Due to a lack of grant funding we have been unable to progress further with these actions and there see no more that can be achieved until this has been completed.

#### Inclusion

In line with previous issues surrounding a lack of funding support, based on a lack of a long term lease and an inactive council we have not been able to improve the facilities for all patrons. This is of great concern to the executive committee, however it is likely this action will not be achieved without council support. This again is likely to be linked to the 'Master Plan'.

## TREASURER REPORT

East Torrens Baseball Club's financial year runs from 1st July to 30th June each year alongside with the Australian Taxation Office's financial year.

This 2019/2020 Season was a tough year for the East Torrens Baseball Club. Our club has been affected by several unfortunate events which have been out of the club's control such as being broken into a couple of times, where thieves stole baseball equipment and other valued club's assets, the COVID-19 and the losing of sponsorship income.

This financial year, East Torrens Baseball Club has suffered a Net Loss of \$5,546.77 Mainly due to the following factors.

#### COVID-19 - Loss of Income

As every club not only in Australia but around the world, our club has also been affected by the COVID-19, being the government restrictions, the principal factor for this year's loss, missing three home grand final games and the club's presentation nights which represents some of our major sources of income.

#### COVID-19 - Unexpected Expenses

The unexpected expenses due to the COVID-19 including the payment of \$2,150.00 on the extra flight ticket for our import player to be able to return home.

#### Loss of Sponsorship Income

The losing of sponsorship income, as this year we could only get \$4,500.00 from sponsors compared with the \$12,500.00 in last season.

Even though the above factors made the club not being able to have a good ending season and, the budgeted amounts were not reached, it is worth noting that the amazing work and effort of the Executive Committee and volunteers who have put their hands up when needed, the overall results were not as bad as they could be during this very challenging season.

We would like to thank Kylie Powell her great support and patience for all our questions in all the finance process and procedures throughout the year, it is much appreciated.



Season 2019/20 was another successful year for the Red Sox senior squad. Home grown youth and development continued to be our priority as we continue the climb back up the SABL ladder.

As always, it was an honour to serve as the Head Coach of the East Torrens Red Sox Baseball Club. Over the last few years; the direction of this club, the pride, history and passion of its members and foresight of our board has created an exceptional sporting family environment that my family and I are proud to call home. Thank you to the board for their continued faith, the players for their commitment and dedication, our members for their support and my staff for their work in building the future of East Torrens.

While extremely proud of our continued improvement and rise in the SABL, it was a bitter sweet season. Following a 30 game battle, with many ups and downs, we fell agonisingly short at the last hurdle. With a 17-13-0 record we ended season 19/20 half of a game out of the playoffs. This improvement on last year's 12 win season was even more impressive considering the loss of 4 established Division 1 starters from the year before. These losses were capably covered by some exceptionally talented junior players and the establishment of some of the more 'senior' young players.

The success of the season included fantastic wins against three top 6 sides. The 17 wins included victories against West Torrens, Goodwood and Port Adelaide. Again, our nemesis proved to be the one run loss. Six of our 13 losses were decided by one run. This included match ups against Port (6th), Goodwood (5th), Henley and Grange (4th) and TWO run one losses to eventual champion, Kensington. Pleasingly, this wasn't due to self-belief, defence or pitching. Within these games, the culprit was entirely offensive production in the clutch.

Our defensive game continued to be our strength and hold us in many battles. To compliment this, our pitching staff was boosted by the inclusion of State young gun, Jack Higginbotham, fresh off a Golden Arm award at the 2019 National tournament and home grown prodigy, Riley Yeatman. 17 year old Higginbotham quickly established himself as a key part of the senior rotation with economic outings (3.43 ERA) against quality opposition and handy offence (.333 BA). Possessing a sporting aggression that belied his age, 'Higgy' took it to many quality teams. Starts against Kensington (1-2 loss) and Port (0-1 loss) heralded his arrival in the league.

15 year old Yeatman completed the fresh injection into the pen. Serving primarily in middle relief / closing, Yeatman sported a 4.74 era, 9.66 K/9 inn with 2 saves. This included a clutch appearance to slam the door at Port and garner the attention of scouts and opposition clubs.

Our season import pitcher, Kellen Croce made major contributions to the club this season. Holding a sub 1 ERA into the final games of the season, Kellen concluded with 6 wins, 1.80 ERA and 82 K's in his 59 innings. This was enough to earn Kellen deserved MVP honours. Mark Stewart experienced a resurgence as 'Special' continued to be the corner-stone of our offence and a thorn in the opposition's side. 'Spesh' hit .344 with a pair of homeruns in an inspiring year.

Two way player, Charlie Ashcroft was voted the Brad Thomas 'Player's Player' by the squad. Ashcroft led the team in wins (7), on base percentage (.429), Doubles (8), HPB (9) and sac bunts (4) while sporting a 3.47 ERA and .303 BA. His commitment to the squad, attitude to the game and love of the club were appropriate examples of character in reflection of Brad Thomas. Ashcroft finished Capps voting 6th in the league.

Other key contributions and achievements worth noting in season 19/20 included Carter Powell's service on the development roster for the Adelaide Giants (ABL) and Craig Powell's success as Under 18 State Head Coach. Carter Powell, Charlie Ashcroft, Kellen Croce (Import) and Jack Higginbotham were all drafted to SABL Super League teams. Jay Sanderson was awarded the SABL 'Gold Glove' at the Capps presentation after a stellar year in the field (.985 FA), making only 2 errors from his 135 opportunities.

Career milestones were achieved as Rhys Lounder (Vs Henley), Luke Chandler (Vs Henley) and Zac Heintze – Unger (Vs Adelaide) all hit their first Division One home-runs. Lounder (.304) and Jaryd Hardman (.333) hitting their way onto the squad, providing critical offense in key games.

With a focus on the development and promotion of youth in our club, thanks must go to Paul Ashworth, Paul Chandler and Darren Unger. Chandler and Unger worked tirelessly in developing our crop of Under 17 players under the umbrella of the senior squad while Ashworth inherited a talented Division 3 team. Ashworth brought a wealth of knowledge and experience to this team that brought the best out of all players. Formed as a senior development team, comprising mainly under aged players, Paul took this squad into the top 4 and looked to seriously contest a Covid shortened season. Paul's work with these young men will be a significant aspect in the future of our club.

Thank you also to our dedicated staff. Karyn Przibilla (D1), Sharon Chandler (D2) and Katherine Ashworth (D3) for the often thankless job of scoring and Paul Chandler for his continued work as E0 / coach. Final thanks to the coaching dream team; Kane Galloway, Craig Powell, Wally Marks and Paul Ashworth for their tireless work in shaping the future of our great club. This is a team that is the envy of the league.

From here, our direction is clear. The continued development of 'hard working, loyal young men' that battle. Our brand of baseball will continue to be a tough, stifling defence, headed by aggressive pitching with selfless, manufactured offense. Together, we must improve our offensive production as our young men establish themselves in Division One, supporting our talented core of pitchers. The way that so many of the players improved their whole game throughout the year showed how they were willing to listen and learn.


Thanks also must be given to Steve and Kym who joined me in coaching this year. Without them we would not have achieved what we did.

With too many players for one team and not quite enough for two, it was decided that from a playing perspective, it was still the best to split the kids into two teams. They would see so much more playing time than if they were one giant team of kids, spending a lot of the game on the bench. U13/1s would have just enough players, and we hoped U13/2s would pick up some extra players as the season kicked off.

Having put up my hand to possibly be an Assistant Coach, I found myself Head Coach of the U13/2 side, with the assistance of Jack Leask. This was a huge learning curve for me, but our passion for baseball and the incredible support of our parents (who I had just met!), were what pulled us through the season.

The team started with James Cross, Charlie Govan, Jackson Hallam, Charlie Leask, Jack Lukomski, Daniel Mosen and Lukas Spencer. In the opening weeks we were joined temporarily by Theo Koch and Lucas Norsworthy and Game 2, we welcomed Shine Han to our team- playing his first season ever. Despite his lack of playing experience, Shine became a valuable 9th member of our team.

These boys had vastly different levels of ability and playing experience, which made player development challenging. We were fortunate to have a couple of experienced pitchers on hand, but the role of catcher was not as clear to begin with. Thankfully Leask and Cross stepped up to the plate (literally) and shared this responsibility initially, with Hallam, Spencer and Mosen as pitchers for the first 4 games. Filling in the gaps when we were short players, we also had U11s, Xavier Bischoff, Sebastian Bravo, Oscar Govan, Harlan King and Hudson Thomas fill in numerous games.

Both Cross and Leask were also keen to pitch, but were not allowed to pitch and catch in the same game. In Game 4, Leask caught for the whole game to allow Cross a turn and Game 5 saw U11, Harlan King fill in as catcher, removing the pressure from Leask and giving Cross another opportunity to show his stuff.

A large blow to the side was Spencer's shoulder injury (in an unrelated scooter incident at home) before Game 6. Unfortunately the same week Han had a family commitment, and without the rescue of our U11s, we would have forfeited, but instead managed a draw.

Game 7 was particularly challenging. It was our first game on the road, Spencer was still injured, Mosen had lost confidence as pitcher two games before (a shame, as he showed great talent and potential), and Hallam and Cross were in danger of perhaps not being able to pitch a game alone within their pitch count. Han accepted the challenge to give pitching a try and performed marvellously for his first go. Leask shouldered the responsibility of catcher. Mosen had his best effort of the season at first base. The U13/2 Redsox somehow pulled it all together to gain a crushing 21-10 victory, bringing them to 7 games undefeated, including 2 draws.

Their first loss came in Game 8, under particularly trying conditions and then a couple of games were scratched due to weather. Spencer returned in the final two weeks before Christmas and with the help of his solid pitching, the team collected two more victories.

Unfortunately the run home through February was not an easy one, playing the other top teams on the ladder-the first in fact, was against top of the ladder, Northern Districts. The Red Sox certainly gave them a run for their money, with Leask performing exceptionally well as catcher. They couldn't quite clinch the win and went down 4-7.

In the second-to-last game, Charlie Govan (who had been practising hard at home) debuted as catcher and did a mighty fine job. In the same game, he really discovered his bat, with two safe hits, including a double. Leask finally got his chance to pitch, but unbelievably was hit and caught out on his first pitch, with side-away. King caught an amazing game, and by now had become a regular fill-in for our team- a win-win, providing him the chance to get some catching experience at a higher level.

Finishing the season this way was understandably disappointing for the lads. Some of his pitching efforts were impressive, he took some great catches, was involved in valuable plays and made big hits, including a home run in Game 10 contributing to a very decent batting average.

#### James Cross - Runner Up MVP

James not surprisingly won Runner Up MVP, just behind Jackson. Happy to take on any role presented to him, including catcher at the beginning of the season, James later earned his title as pitcher, pitching several flawless innings. With still another year to play at the U13 level, and with his cheerful, go-getter attitude, James has enormous potential. I look forward to seeing him next season.

#### Jack Lukomski - Coach's Award.

Jack was my obvious pick for this award. His improvement this season was vast, but this was greatly attributed to his attitude and commitment. Always attentive, respectful, a kind teammate- his tenacity paid off. We hope to see him join us in U15s next season.

Special thanks to my Assistant Coach and Game Planner, Jack Leask, we learned a lot together, Carla Nielsen and Karen Cross who stepped up enthusiastically to learn scoring, pitch counters Kim Lukomski (who also lent a hand at training and setting up games) and Karina Tarrant (who was always eager to lend a hand or a gazebo), Andrew Govan for carrying equipment, Clinton Hallam for helping with training in the final weeks, Scott Mosen for photography, and in fact all parents for helping out one time or another, including ferrying kids when needed.
