To this end, the Executive believed the 100th year was the perfect time to set direction for the next 100 years, inviting our members to come together to be part of choosing and naming the values that we stand for, that will lead our charter moving forward. Led by our Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Officer, Amber Bisset and our President, Damien Norsworthy, we commenced this important piece of work. The collaboration was inspiring, allowing for some reflection and building some momentum from the recent celebrations for what we wanted the future to look like. TREASURER

The club's financial year runs from 1st July to the 30th June of each year and as such these accounts are only current as at the 23rd June 2024 on an accrual basis and will be finalised at the end of June 2024. Although we are not expecting any further significant expenses the figures recorded are still subject to change.

The 23-24 season has seen the club make an estimated profit of approximately \$1.2k which is a solid result for the club. The club remains in a healthy financial position and continues to be debt free.

Income for 23-24 was up 8.3% year on year with total expenses at \$163k which was higher than last year by 11.6%.

The greatest increase in expenses for the 23-24 season was for the 100 Years on the Diamond celebration. Although on paper this event recorded greater expenses than income this was a fantastic celebration held over the November weekend where all current and former members, sponsors and community were welcomed, and our Club's treasured history relived. The 100 Year Steering Committee put together an event they can be proud of and as ETBC Members we can all be proud of.

Our cash Sponsorship for season 23-24 reached \$28,500 up \$6,500 on the previous season and Player Sponsorship was up approximately \$2.3k to approximately \$4.2k. This is another strong result for the Club and an example of the hard work which happens behind the scenes in securing sponsorships. One of our many valued sponsors, Australian Fire Services, also ensured copies of the 100 Years on the Diamond book were available for every member. We thank all our sponsors and partners, both new and ongoing. The Club appreciates your support!

Stef Gratton came onboard the Executive Committee this season as Registrations Manager, doing a great job, and assisted me with the reconciliations of member funds we received. Junior memberships were down slightly for the season but stable. However senior memberships were down 30%. A significant contributor was the lack of a Division 8 competition, the withdrawal from Women's Div 1 and no Under 19's competition. Fortunately, our increase in sponsorship was able to cover our membership shortfall on last season.

Canteen sales were down 22% this season which can be attributed to some unfavourable weather and several less teams we fielded, canteen expenses were also down by 28%. However, the overall profitability for the canteen over seasons 23-24 (\$11,850) and 22-23 (\$11,735) were almost identical. A big thank you to all the volunteers who assisted in the canteen throughout the season and to Angela Probert who arranges ordering/delivery of stock and manages the hired help.

We welcomed Bob Hollands back behind the bar and Bob probably spent more time at the club volunteering than at home. Thanks Bob for all your assistance throughout the season! Our profit from the bar was 19k, down slightly (approximately \$1.4k) which can be attributed to the increase of bar expenses (approximately \$1k).

Regalia posted a solid profit of approximately \$3.5k with plenty of regalia and merchandise purchased for the Club's 100 th year. Marnie, Steve and Damien put in many hours of sourcing, sampling, ordering and distributing regalia and merchandise over the season.

I also want to point out that the Club has received \$56,000 in Grants during the 23-24 financial year for the Yard Ball Program, Volunteer Grant and an Equipment Funding Grant which have been secured by the hard work of Amber Bisset.

Given the financial strength of the Club the Executive Committee prudently decided to hold some of the Club's cash at bank in a Term Deposit earning greater interest and will assist in offsetting some expenses. Due to the unfortunate thefts of equipment, the insurance provisions allowed us to replace our pitching machines through the season and some other equipment in advance of the 24-25 season. We anticipate there will be more spending in the 24-25 season which will be of benefit to our Members.

Thank you to all our Members, Executive Committee, Co-ordinators, Delegates, Coaches, Volunteers, Umpires and Sponsors who all contribute to make our Club a great place to be.

REGISTRATIONS & MEMBERSHIPS

This was my first year managing registrations and I'd like to start with thanking Katherine Ashworth for her outstanding service and management in this area for the past several seasons. The 2023 off-season presented some challenges, so the support she gave me as I settled into the role was exceptional, so thank you Katherine.

The first challenge that presented was Baseball SA's decision to switch from the Revsport platform to the new Gameday registrations platform, which meant rebuilding almost everything from the ground up. There were some learnings taken out of the transition, and while functionality has been lost in some areas, the new system allows us to do some good things with registrations.

The second challenge presented in the off-season was Baseball SA's fee increase coupled with the rising cost of living. After an 8% increase in the 2022 off-season, there was another increase that averaged out to a 33% rise in Baseball SA fees for juniors (including Tball), and an average of a 14% rise in fees for seniors (men and women). As a club we recognised that while operating costs had gone up due to inflation, we also didn't want to further impact families who were struggling with the cost of living. We feel we struck a balance between the two perspectives and chose to raise our club fees by 6% for all registration types. In total, between the Baseball SA increase and our own club fee increase this averaged out to a 14.5% increase across the board for all full season registrations, which was a great outcome given the increases handed down by Baseball SA and how much costs have risen in other areas.

With regards to registration numbers, this season we had a total of 177 registered members - down from 235 last season:

56 Senior Mens (78 last season) 23 Senior Womens (38) 90 Juniors - Tball to U19 (100) 8 Volunteers (15)

I believe the transition to the new registrations platform has held back our registered volunteer and life member numbers. This will be something to focus on moving forward. If you are a volunteer or life member with the club, please reach out so we can assist with registering you and you can then receive club updates and events via email.

With regards to the playing numbers it is fair to say that cost of living played a part, as well as a significant cohort leaving to other clubs. There was also an attempted scheduling change by Baseball SA that played a large part in an entire senior team folding. Some good trends though were the holding or slight increase in numbers of lower junior levels, which is excellent given the state of things as they are the foundation and future of our great club.

Finally I would like to say thank you to all the members that worked with us as we moved to a new system and completed full payment of fees this year. Thank you to the Executive Committee, Management Committee and countless canteen, umpiring, grounds, coaching and management volunteers that help our club run. The atmosphere around the club on game days, and especially across the 100 Year Weekend, this season was wonderful and that's because of all your hard work.

Key Achievements

Raiise Program: We partnered with the Raiise Program to deliver their Respectful Club Environments session. This initiative emphasised the importance of gender equality, challenging stereotypes, and empowering participants to promote respectful behaviour in our club and the wider community.

Grant Funding Success: We secured funding to: Assist with programs and equipment, funded by the South Australian Government through the Office for Recreation, Sport and Racing.

Support our volunteers in their important work, funded through the Volunteer Grants Activity, part of the Commonwealth Government's work to support the efforts of Australia's volunteers.

Design, develop and deliver an inclusive baseball program in 2024/25 and 2025/26, funded by the Australian Government Department of Social Services. This is an exciting opportunity for ETBC to support people with disability, their families and carers to participate, contribute and benefit from mainstream community activities, by joining our baseball community.

Member Feedback: Our player engagement and satisfaction survey provided valuable insights from our women's and men's senior teams. While members generally find our club supportive and inclusive, feedback highlighted areas for improvement, including the need for clearer guidance on accessing support channels beyond individual teams. Additionally, members expressed willingness to volunteer, particularly in mentoring and event organisation, which will be crucial to the success of our upcoming activities and initiatives in 2024/25.

Future Planning Workshops: We hosted our first of two future planning workshops, which focused on identifying core values for our next strategic plan. The session served as a foundation for setting short, medium, and long-term goals and activities, aligned with our values, at the second session in early 2024/25.

Upcoming Initiatives: Moving forward, our focus will be on finalising the strategic plan based on member insights. We aim to provide inclusive education and training opportunities to build our capacity in DEI matters. Furthermore, we plan to strengthen community engagement through local partnerships and seek opportunities to enhance facility accessibility and appropriateness for our members. A key milestone in 2024/25 will be the launch of our inclusive baseball program, which aims to promote inclusivity and participation among individuals with disabilities, their families, and carers.

We will look to integrate this with the recent member engagement session at the Feathers that will also assist in having a plan which is developed through extensive consultation with stakeholders, reflecting the collective aspirations and strategic direction of our club.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the tireless efforts of our dedicated volunteers. From coaching and mentoring our players to maintaining the grounds and organizing events, our volunteers are the backbone of East Torrens Baseball Club. 

Congratulations to Jack Wilton from our team who was also selected in the State U16 Team.





T-BALL & PEE WEE



This was my second year running the teeball program, it must be said with a tonne of work done by my wife Stacey as well. Looking back on my report from last season I made some goals to advertise the program earlier in an effort to grow it and also a bit more work on throwing skills. We started off the pre-season by getting the word out to all the schools in our area and Stace also had the brilliant idea of advertising on community noticeboards too. Another change we made was we decided to run three come and try nights instead of just one. They were all free and they did a great job at building momentum into the teeball season and were a huge success as we had a large number of first timers come out and register for the program. Even better was a lot of those first timers actually ended up playing PeeWee (U9s) this season, which was fantastic to see.

The program this year took a greater focus on listening to instructions, learning the positions on the field, both when you're baserunning and when you're fielding. We then followed that with some dedicated throwing warmups, which are very similar to what the higher grades do, which will ease that transition. We then move into a focus drill to reinforce throwing at a target (crate in a circle or a relay race usually) and we moved to working on crowhops towards the end of the season, a skill that will benefit the kids as they move up through the ranks. We then finish our sessions with a 30 min game. We would split the group into 2 or 4 teams depending on numbers and alternate hitting and fielding for 5 minutes at a time. We had two games running most weeks which showed us we were getting more consistent numbers week to week, even though the numbers didn't grow as a whole. We would generally have a game for more experienced players, most of which played peewee, and a game for our newer and younger kids to learn the rules and flow of the game.

We were also able to find some spare equipment which allowed us to furnish any newcomers with their own glove, so thanks very much to the committee for supporting the program in that way. As mentioned numbers-wise we had a small increase compared with what we had last season which is a great thing as we had a larger than expected number move up out of the program. Next season we re focused on retention and subsequently growth from our younger players building on the skills we've learned this season. A big thank you to all the parents that helped out corralling the kids every Friday.

Over on the Peewee side, last season we had just 6 players for our first game, this year we had 14(!) players thanks largely to the success of our Come and Try nights. We were joined by a 15th in the third week and from there we went! The fantastic thing was that over half of the team were first- timers from the aforementioned Come and Try nights and the improvement across the season in all of the kids, but especially the newcomers, was outstanding. They got better at listening to instructions, they got better at reading the game, their hitting was outstanding and their fielding came along in leaps and bounds. By the end of the season the kids would regularly make hard contact with good swings off of the pitching with very rarely needing the tee.

T-BALL & PEE WEE

On the fielding side they got to a point where they were regularly reading and making plays on their own, covering bases where they needed to, moving the ball quickly when it needed to and even several unassisted double plays off their own backs with no input from the coaches. Our last game of the season the opposing coach was very kind in saying that we were arguably the best team they had played, which to me says a lot about how far they came from the start of the season to the end. My favourite things from their season though was the enthusiasm and support the kids gave to their teammates. It was truly a sight (and sound!) to behold, I called them the Chaos Crew for a reason, and they delivered on that every week.

A big thanks to a few people: Katherine Whaites who was my team manager for the season - she kept everyone in lineand organised the bench which is not an easy job with 15 kids! Also a big thanks to David Pilkington, Byron Hatfield and Steve Kirby as well just for all their help coaching the boys out in the field. They helped reinforce some of the things that we're learning and reminding them of what to do in in particular situations. They were all outstanding and really helped me pull all this together.
