TREASURER

The club's financial year runs from 1st July to the 30th of June of each year and as such these accounts are only current as at the 23rd of June 2025 on an accrual basis and will be finalised at the end of June 2025. Although we are not expecting any further significant expenses the figures recorded are still subject to change.

The 24-25 season has seen the club make an estimated profit of approximately \$9,700 which is a very pleasing result for the club. The club remains in a healthy financial position and continues to be debt free. The profit was achieved even though total income for 24/25 was down 11.7% year on year however, total expenses at \$142k was down 16% or approximately \$27k. The variance in income and expenses against 23/24 can largely be attributed to the 100-Year celebrations. Regalia sales declined by 40%, which we had anticipated, given the higher volumes of regalia sold during the Club's 100-year celebrations. Regalia still recorded a solid profit of approximately \$1,500 for 24/25.

We recorded \$21,500 cash Sponsorship for season 24/25 which was down \$7,000 or 25% on the previous year and Player Sponsorship of nearly \$4,500. Our Vice President from season 24/25 has taken onboard the sponsorship portfolio and is in the process of securing new sponsors for season 25/26 and looking to continue our relationships with current sponsors for the seasons ahead. We thank all our sponsors and partners, both new and ongoing. The Club appreciates your support!

Club memberships has remained strong over the past season. Although Senior memberships appear to have decreased on the Profit and Loss Report (P&L) I would point our members to the Canteen Levy line in the P&L report. I have included this line as the Canteen Levy amount of \$3,380 comes directly from club memberships. This represents each member's contribution (\$20 from every full membership) to payments we must make to have a canteen manager in place. This amount doesn't represent the full amount paid, however gives our members an indication of where a portion of their club membership fees are allocated.

Canteen sales were marginally up by 1.7% and recorded a profit of \$10,400 in comparison to the profit from 23/24 of \$11,850. Profitability has been impacted by the increased costs of running the canteen with costs increased by 7.1% in comparison to the previous year.

Bar sales were down 6.6% with a profit of \$18,205 recorded in comparison to the profit from 23/24 of \$19,134. The bar expenses were also 8% lower than the previous year. Given there were several Saturdays where there was only one senior game being played at the club the results of the canteen and bar are a pleasant surprise. Hopefully with some fixture adjustments by Baseball SA over the coming seasons we can look forward to maximising the number of teams we have playing home games on the same day hopefully resulting in stronger canteen and bar turnover.

A big thank you to all the volunteers who assisted in the canteen and bar throughout the season, and we encourage all our members to contribute some of their time during the coming season in these areas.

TREASURER

Although there were several areas across both income and expenses which contributed to the overall profit, the Social and Fundraising line added profit of approximately \$7,000 over 24/25. This is an outstanding result for the club and many thanks are extended to the numerous volunteers who sacrificed their time and organised things such as meat raffles, volunteered at Bunnings barbecues and many other club events. A massive thankyou to our members who supported these fund-raising initiatives with their hard-earned cash. This is greatly appreciated and allows us to reinvest some money back into the club.

Some areas we have invested club and grant funds in 24/25 for our members and participants include improving the batting cages, L-Frames, repairs to the turtle, Blast Motion, pitching machine balls, baseballs, equipment for Juniors, Baum bats and Driveline training equipment. We have also purchased items to assist our volunteers in the canteen and devices for streaming live feeds of our games. No doubt we will be looking to make further investments in club facilities for our members and participants in the upcoming season.

Thank you to all our Members, Executive Committee, Co-ordinators, Delegates, Coaches, Volunteers, Umpires and Sponsors who all contribute to make our Club a great place to be.

REGISTRATIONS & MEMBERSHIPS

Thank you to all members for registering and paying their fees completely this year.

With this being the second year of the Gameday system there were less issues and the process seemed to be altogether rather smooth.

Baseball SA raised their fees again this season by 5% for senior players and between 5-8% for juniors (including Tball). The largest increase though was in the 3 game memberships that increased by 40% for the BA and BSA components. As a club we determined a 3% fee increase was appropriate as this was in line with cost of living increases, and mitigated the larger BSA increases to a degree. As always we want to make baseball as accessible as possible, for as many people as possible, while also being fiscally responsible. We believe the decisions we made around the fee increases struck a good balance and met those goals.

With regards to registration numbers, this season we had a total of 202 registered members - up from 177 last season, which is a wonderful result. The registrations break down as follows:

59 Senior Mens (56 last season)
27 Senior Womens (23)
101 Juniors - Tball to U19 (90)
10 Yardball (New)
5 Volunteers (8)

There is still some work to do in getting our Life Members and volunteers registered, as this aids them in receiving news of events at the club. A larger focus will be placed on this next season.

Seeing playing numbers bounce back is wonderful to see, and that it's largely in our junior programs is even better. It will be interesting to see how the new Baseball SA competition structure affects numbers next season, but a 14% increase in membership is great news.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION

The 2024/25 season marked strong progress in embedding diversity, equity and inclusion at East Torrens Baseball Club (ETBC). Key initiatives focused on creating a safe, welcoming and inclusive environment for all members, players, volunteers, supporters and the broader community.

Grants and Funding Support: Two grants secured in 2023/24 were fully spent in 2024/25. Funding from the South Australian Government's Office for Recreation, Sport and Racing and the Commonwealth Government's Volunteer Grants Activity supported technology upgrades, volunteer resources, and program delivery.

Strategic and Action Planning: In mid-2024, ETBC held two Future Planning Workshops to involve members in shaping the club's direction. Insights from these sessions informed the 10-year Strategic Plan and 2025-26 Action Plan, outlining the club's vision, priorities, and goals with annual steps for implementation. Both plans were shared for member feedback and are now available online.

Yard Ball Program: The Yard Ball Program is ETBC's inclusive baseball initiative designed to increase participation, specifically for children, young people, and women with intellectual disability, psychosocial disability, and autism. Launched in 2024/25, Season 1 was a great success, thanks to the dedication of participants, coaches, buddies, and the wider club community. A full overview of the program, its outcomes, and future plans is provided in the Yard Ball Program section of this report.

Player Engagement & Wellbeing Initiatives: Late in the season, ETBC was invited to join Play Well Minds, a free seven-week mental resilience program for teenagers. Though interest was expressed, the program did not proceed this season. The club remains open to similar future opportunities.

Raiise Gender Equality Assessment and Planning Program: Following participation in the Raiise Respectful Club Environments Program in early 2024, ETBC has committed to the Raiise Gender Equality Assessment and Planning Program for 2025/26. This program will review gender equity practices and develop a Gender Equity Action Plan. This fully funded 12-month initiative will provide valuable support for advancing inclusion and club development.

Player Engagement & Satisfaction Surveys: The second annual survey collected 31 responses from senior men's (Div 1-3) and women's teams (Div 2-3). Feedback was positive overall, highlighting an inclusive culture and good coach relationships. Players valued skill development but requested more situational and pitching training. Interest was strong in creating a women's leadership group and volunteering opportunities, especially in event organisation and diversity initiatives. Suggestions included improving facilities and off-field social events to strengthen connections. The executive committee has carefully reviewed this valuable feedback and is committed to implementing improvements that enhance player experiences and club activities for the 2025/26 season. Additionally, the committee is actively exploring ways to broaden feedback opportunities for all members throughout 2025/26.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION

Thank You: Thanks to all players, families, volunteers, and supporters who helped make ETBC more inclusive this season.

A special thank you to Tony Probert, whose baseball knowledge, coaching expertise, and ability to engage participants were invaluable as we worked together to develop and deliver the first Yard Ball season. Thanks also to all Yard Ball participants, coaches, and buddies - your commitment made the program a great success.

Thanks also to Damien Norsworthy for his ongoing support across DEI initiatives and the Yard Ball Program, including developing branding and promotional materials that raised the program's profile. Appreciation is also extended to the executive committee for their continued support, and special recognition goes to Carmen Bischoff for securing funding and leading the successful Coaching Pathways and Women's Come & Try programs - initiatives that continue to broaden opportunities for both our members and the wider community.

We've continued to grow as an inclusive and welcoming club this season, driven by the outstanding dedication and passion of our volunteers. Their ongoing commitment has been essential to our success, and we look forward to building on this momentum into the future.

YARD BALL PROGRAM

In 2024/25, East Torrens Baseball Club (ETBC) proudly launched the inaugural season of its Yard Ball Program, an inclusive baseball initiative designed to reduce barriers to participation for people with disability. Funded by the Australian Government Department of Social Services, Yard Ball focuses on creating safe, welcoming, and accessible opportunities, specifically for children, young people, and women with intellectual disability, psychosocial disability, and autism.

Between February and March 2025, the program delivered 21 tailored sessions across three streams:

- Mightee-Ball (ages 4–7)
- Sox Stars & Sluggers (ages 8–18)
- Women and Teenage Girls (ages 15+)

A total of 11 participants were supported by 10 trained coaches and 11 teenage buddies, creating an environment where players could build skills, confidence, and community. Inclusive game modifications, one-on-one support, and a focus on enjoyment and connection were central to the program. Club-wide events, including end-of-season awards, further promoted visibility and inclusion within the broader ETBC community.

To embed inclusive practices across the club, several initiatives were introduced:

- A dedicated Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Subcommittee was formed, bringing together individuals with lived experience, subject matter experts, and club representatives to guide program design and implementation.
- A DEI Awareness Session was attended by 30 club members, coaches, and volunteers, building a shared understanding of inclusive values and approaches.
- All Yard Ball coaches and buddies completed inclusive sport training, focusing on respectful communication, activity adaptation, and understanding diverse support needs.
- Key club policies were reviewed and updated to reflect ETBC's commitment to inclusion and safety, including the Member Protection Policy, Disability Inclusion Policy, and Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy.

We extend our sincere thanks to all Yard Ball participants, whose enthusiasm, courage, and commitment brought the program to life and inspired everyone involved. Special appreciation goes to our dedicated coaches and buddies - your time, energy, and support were essential in creating a safe, enjoyable, and inclusive environment where players could build skills, confidence, and friendships. Thanks also to the families for their trust, and to the broader ETBC membership - your ongoing support and encouragement has been vital in building a more inclusive and connected club community.

Special thanks to the DEI Subcommittee for their generous time, expertise, and ongoing guidance, which has been invaluable in shaping the program to be inclusive and responsive to the needs of our participants and community.

YARD BALL PROGRAM

Appreciation is extended to Sustainable Value for supporting the measurement of the program's impact; Raiise for policy support and their investment in our club through the upcoming Gender Equality Assessment and Planning Program; and Volunteerability for facilitating a valuable and engaging DEI awareness session, that helped deepen our club's understanding and commitment to inclusion.

Looking ahead, Season 2 (2025/26) will expand the Yard Ball Program to include up to three additional clubs, broadening its reach and impact across metropolitan and regional South Australia. A key priority for the upcoming season is the development of transition pathways to support participants moving into mainstream junior and senior baseball programs. This will involve addressing barriers and promoting inclusive support such as adapted rules, mentorship, and accessible facilities. Building on the strong foundation of Season 1, ETBC remains committed to creating opportunities where all players can belong, develop their skills, and enjoy the game in a welcoming and inclusive environment.

STRATEGY & PLANNING

This year, my focus as Strategy and Planning Coordinator was on strategic direction, grant acquisition, and volunteer development—all aimed at strengthening ETBC's inclusive and community-driven environment.

Working with the Executive Committee, we finalised ETBC's ten-year Strategic Plan, which sets a clear direction for the Club. Developed through extensive consultation, including opportunities where members were invited to collaborate and provide feedback, the plan outlines goals in facility improvement, participation growth, community engagement, and volunteer and player development. It now serves as a roadmap for long-term sustainability and success.

Fostering Inclusion, Community Spirit, and Volunteer Engagement

This year, we supported volunteer development through a Scoring Workshop to help new and returning volunteers build confidence and knowledge. I also ran a series of second-hand gear sales to reduce barriers to participation and ensure all members could access the equipment they needed. In continuing the tradition of the Opening Night Red Sox Wiffle Ball Tournament, I helped coordinate a fun, inclusive event where players from Juniors, Women's, and Seniors (Div 1–3) formed 10 mixed teams. With perfect weather and great energy, new and returning families came together to compete, connect, and celebrate the start of the season. It was a fantastic reflection of our club's welcoming culture, and we were proud to welcome our international import, Jude Ard, into the ETBC family.

Successful Grant Funding

Women's Participation Grant: This grant allowed us to run a mid-season come and try day and provide starter kits (glove, helmet, hat, and ball) for new female players, reducing financial barriers and supporting growth in the women's program. Thanks to these resources, we can offer the kits again in the upcoming season to build on the momentum our women's program has gained this year, further promoting participation and inclusion.

STRATEGY & PLANNING

Coaching Pathways Grant: This grant supported three development sessions that delivered strong outcomes in social connection, wellbeing, skill development, access to services, and the capacity of our volunteer-involving organisation. As part of the initiative, we developed a new coaching manual (in both printed and digital formats) and will soon launch an online portal with up-to-date drills and resources—enhancing coach support and consistency across the club. A highlight of the program was a celebration event at the Feathers Hotel, where we were privileged to hear from the outstanding Matthew Clarke, who generously shared his expertise in coaching and community engagement.



Infrastructure Context:

Major facility upgrades have been delayed due to the ongoing Payneham Pool redevelopment however, the Club remains committed to making practical, high-impact improvements in the meantime. This year, we focused on enhancements that benefit members now—such as upgrading the batting tunnels with new netting and expanding two areas to improve usability—while continuing to plan for future developments aligned with our Strategic Plan.

Week two was a run-fest as the Sox smashed Henley & Grange/Port 28-8. Archie Carman led with 3 hits, positivity, and poise, while Lucas Norsworthy delivered 3 hits including a double. Owen Couzner launched a grand slam, and 12 team hits proved the Red Sox could pile on runs quickly.

Middle Season – Mixed Results, Strong Individual Performances

The team showed resilience in a narrow 9-7 loss to Golden Grove. Owen Couzner threw 3 strong innings with 6 strikeouts and chipped in two hits. The next week, despite a heavy 16-0 loss to Goodwood, Archie Carman stood tall in centerfield with five defensive outs and added a hit. A 12-10 win against Kensington was a season highlight. Couzner tossed 3 scoreless innings, and Wilton smashed his second triple of the season. The season ended with a tough 17-3 loss to Henley & Grange, but there were silver linings—Harlan King reached base in every plate appearance, while both Logan Arnold and Lucas Weldon made their first U17 starts on the mound, showing courage and growth.
